Candy reported that we received a thank you note from Wounded Warriors on behalf of Tom Wise. There were no other secretary reports.

There was no Treasurer report.

Committee reports – Show

Candy reported that judging assignments are now up on the AKC website. Discussion regarding trophies. if you want to sponsor a trophy for your breed, or a Group (either Regular or NOHS) please let Vikki Jaramillo or Yvonne Roscoe know right away! We have to have everything ready for the premium no later than May 1.

Thea Tsurumoto will offer CGC, CGCA, & Trick Dog at our shows again this year.. We will put them in front of the gazebo where they were last year, and we will have Grounds & parking keep handlers back a a little to leave more space for CGC.

Candy spoke with Wayne regarding parking. They do not want to charge us any more than \$5.50 per rig. They will be set up in the small parking lot, so they will keep an eye on it for us. They will also talk to the professional handlers and tell them that their assistants cannot park in the small lot & will flush the small lot out at night so it's ready Sunday morning. Motion Judy Davis, second Bob Kinney to change our parking company this year & use Wayne. Motion passed unanimously.

We need to hire janitors still for the show weekend.

The Belgian Malinois club is coming to join us this year with back to back specialties on Friday.

We are looking at July 18 for our match this summer. Cindy Craig will be in town & will be match chairman. Elaine Oxborrow will assist her.

Cindy Craig is working on T-shirts & hats for us. She will have a report to the board in the near future.

No new member application to read. Kelso Craig was absent.

New Business

Susanne Haug would like to see more continuing education at meetings. Candy told her that she had been talking to somebody about starting the breed information presentations again, maybe 3-4 times per year. If you have ideas for presentations that can be made at the meeting, please let a board member know.

Jane Myers talked to us about adding events like Agility, FastCAT, & Herding to help promote the club. Scent work brings in a lot of money. You can do these in conjunction with your show, it does not have to be a separate event. The Pup Pals program is a great program to get involved with. They send cards from dogs to sick kids.

We discussed the Reno Pet Show with Jane. She brought some brochures for us, AKC posters, along with a TV & Fire Stick to use at the show.

A private donor paid for an 8' x 3' banner for Friends of the Northern Nevada Dog Fancy at the Reno Pet Show. We need volunteers to bring in their dogs for 2-4 hour shifts. The show is three days, March 27-29, 2020.

AKC is offering a Puppy of Achievement certificate now. You earn points in 4-6, 6-9, & 9-12. Best Bred By puppy is now in the works!

A question came up about legislation. Candy has heard from Chris Vaught that they're already working on some bills we'll need to stay on top of. They're trying to change the number of hours you can leave your dog tied out - down from the 14 we fought for recently back to 8. This will make you a criminal if you tie your dog up before you go to work & untie him when you get home. The current 14 hour allowance makes room for people who work 12 hour shifts. Sheila Goth in Government Relations at AKC is to work with. Robert Miller is still the area Rep for legislation.

AKC is looking at allowing three shows per year for clubs in areas like here.

Candy asked Jane if the "Good Dog" ad on facebook is an AKC program. **It is not.**

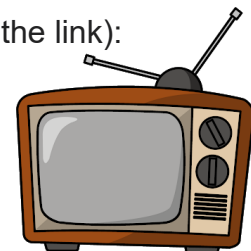

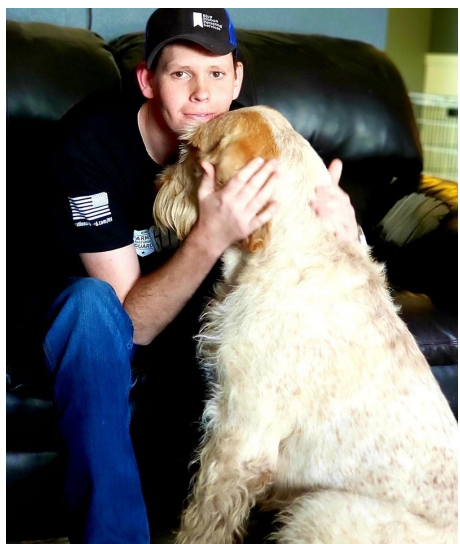

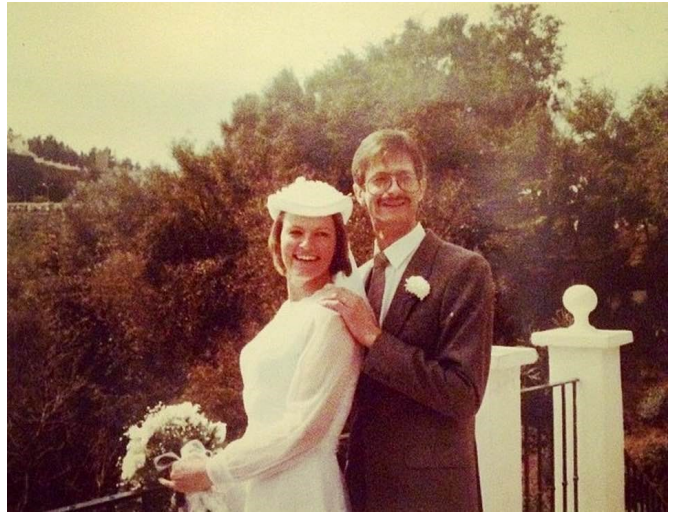

News from the February 2020 [AKC] Board Meeting

Announcing the National Owner-Handled Series Level of Achievement

The AKC National Owner-Handled Series (NOHS) has been a tremendous success, viewed very favorably by the fancy as a mechanism to showcase dogs exhibited by non-professional owner-handlers. In the time since its inception, the AKC has developed an NOHS ranking system and launched the AKC NOHS Finals, an event held annually in December during the week of the AKC National Championship in Orlando, Florida.

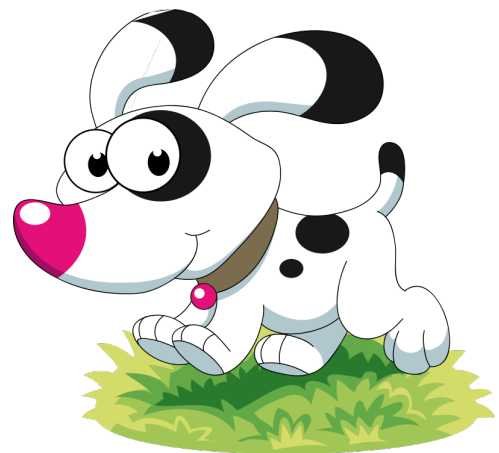
Consistent with the AKC's ongoing efforts to grow the NOHS program and the sport overall, the Board of Directors at its February 2020 meeting voted to approve the implementation of NOHS Levels of Achievement to include Bronze, Silver, Gold and Platinum awards.

The Bronze, Silver, Gold and Platinum NOHS Awards of Achievement will be earned by obtaining a predetermined number of NOHS points for each level and award. This will mimic the inaugural levels of recognition for the Grand Champion title introduced in May 2011.

RECOGNITION LEVEL	MINIMUM NOHS POINTS
<i>Bronze</i>	250
<i>Silver</i>	500
<i>Gold</i>	1,000
<i>Platinum</i>	2,000

For each Achievement Level, the first owner of the dog will receive a certificate to commemorate the accomplishment and a NOHS Achievement Level pin. The pin will be the NOHS logo cast to reflect the color of the Achievement Level. As this is not a titling program, it will not reflect as a prefix or suffix to the dog's AKC registered name. Dogs will be grandfathered back to the beginning of the NOHS program (2012). Dogs grandfathered would be awarded only the highest Level of Achievement certificate and pin that they have earned.

More information on the new NOHS Levels of Achievement will be sent in the near future. **The expected launch date for the NOHS Levels of Achievement is July 1, 2020.**

"The dedication and commitment of our breeders, exhibitors, clubs, business partners and staff have resulted in the unparalleled success of our sports. We enthusiastically look forward to spreading the joy of canine companionship by growing our existing sports and developing new activities that meet the interests and lifestyles of all segments of the dog-owning public."

The AKC acknowledges the accomplishments of dogs in 26 different sports. It is America's only dog organization to include the full range of Performance Events, each of which is designed to evaluate how well purpose-bred dogs perform the function that a breed was developed to do. In every measurable category; unique breeders, events and entries, the AKC Performance Program far surpasses that of any registry worldwide on an annual basis. This includes:

- Pointing breed hunting tests and field trials
- Retriever hunting tests and field trials
- Spaniel hunting tests and field trials
- Field trials for Hounds (Beagles, Dachshunds & Basset Hounds)
- Coonhound events
- Herding events
- Earthdog events
- Lure Coursing events
- Search and Rescue
- Plus, unique breed-specific performance events held by AKC National Breed Clubs (examples – carting and working dog sports)

The AKC administers the largest Companion Event program in the world. Companion Events, open to all breeds including mixed breeds, are designed to strengthen and demonstrate the human – canine bond. Companion Event sports include Agility, Obedience, Scent Work, Tracking and Rally.

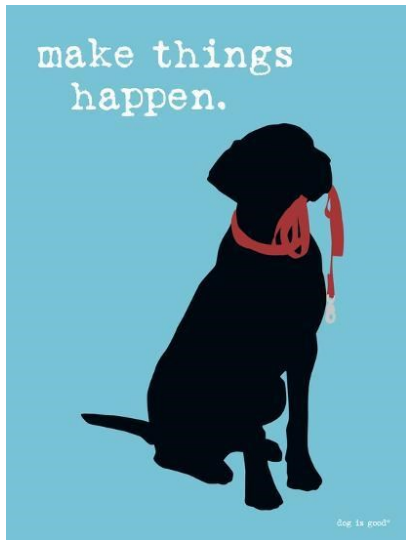
In Conformation the breadth and scope of shows exceed over 1,400,000 entries at events run by dedicated clubs that educate the public about responsible dog ownership, health and the human-canine bond.

AKC's Family Dog activities were created to demonstrate the manners that make dogs good family members and welcomed partners in the community. These activities include the Canine Good Citizen program, STAR Puppy, Therapy Dog, Trick Dog, Farm Dog Certified, the Fit Dog program and AKC's Temperament Test.

Additionally, the AKC has a strong affiliation program with other dog sport organizations including North America Diving Dogs (NADD), the North American Flyball Association (NAFA), the Barn Hunt Association and UpDog Challenge (disc dogs). A dog's accomplishments in these events can be recorded on their AKC pedigree.
