March 2, 2021

Meeting called to order by President Candy Roper at 7:07 p.m.

Motion Carolyn Goepner, second Elaine Oxborrow to approve November 10, 2020 minutes as printed in the November newsletter. Motion passed unanimously.

Secretary reports:

No secretary reports.

Treasurer report:

Lexine Thompson reported a beginning balance of \$34,474.37 with expenses of \$1,245.34 and income of \$587.17 for an ending balance of \$33,816.20.

Candy received a call on the club phone recently. A gentleman was looking for a Labrador Retriever and was amazed he reached a live person. After talking a while he found out we're a nonprofit and asked how we get money. Candy explained dog shows and public education. He then asked if we take donations. Candy received a check for \$100 from him for public education! She will send a thank you note. We don't currently get a lot of calls, but this was worthwhile.

Committees

Sunshine Committee:

Joan Newman fell and broke her hip and is at Carson Rehab in Carson City. Bob Newman said she has tested positive for COVID. Bob is having a difficult time communicating with her. Carolyn Goepner said cards would be appreciated.

Show Committee:

The show committee held a meeting February 20 which included discussion about the Fuji Park masterplan. After discussing the proposed changes, Candy sent our input to the Parks Department. There will be a Board of Supervisors meeting to discuss the park master plan in April. This will be a long project because there is no funding at this time except for arena grandstands. There will not be any construction in the park, exhibit hall, or parking lots during our shows this year. If anything is under construction, it would be something like the streets which is beyond Park control. We can't attend the Supervisors meeting physically but can submit written or phone in comments. Elaine Oxborrow asked if that will change. There is another change coming March 15th but Elaine Bergenheier is not sure how it will affect things. There has been some loosening of restrictions for now and more could be coming in May.

Candy reported the Rottweilers aren't coming to our show this year. They have decided to go to Reno instead. Shelties are coming and should have about the same entries as the Rottweilers. They will be doing back-to-back shows on Friday and concurrent Saturday and Sunday.

Belgian Tervurens and Belgian Sheepdogs may not come. One judge on our panel was requested by them but then we lost the two other Herding judges. The people they suggested to replace them only had Herding and we need Herding and Working. The two clubs are concerned about expenses. Candy put them in touch with the Shelties so they can talk about possibly sharing judges.

Over the weekend Candy received an email from the Show Chairman for the Biewer Terrier Club of America National Specialty. They are looking at possibly coming to our shows this fall but are looking at other clubs as well. Candy sent information and they were excited about it but she isn't sure if they will come. It could mean between 30-75 dogs. Elaine Oxborrow asked how many days. Candy isn't sure yet. This is a breed just accepted by AKC this year.

Candy talked with the stewards association, we are on their list this fall. It will be between \$125-\$150 per steward. Candy has not yet been in touch with Truckee Meadows Dog Training Club regarding obedience and rally stewards.

Kiwanis is willing to feed the judges and workers again. Carolyn Goepner asked if we know what COVID restrictions there may be. Nobody knows at this time. Elaine Bergenheier will be our COVID coordinator. She will help keep track what we need to do to comply. The premium is due before we know what restrictions will be. We need to plan as though we are having a full pandemic show. Carolyn asked if we have someone to accept COVID waivers for the specialties on Friday. Carolyn said you can get inexpensive wristbands.

Candy said there is a local food vendor interested in doing our show that does hamburgers, hot dogs, garlic fries, chili and such. Last show only a few judges ate breakfast. This guy would be willing to do breakfast burritos for any judges that wanted breakfast leaving Kiwanis to get coffee ready in the morning and getting lunch going. Bob Kinney said Paradise that has done it the last few years is interested in being at the show. Bob doesn't think that she offers hamburgers.

Candy asked if Paradise has an exclusive for food. Bob said no. Elaine Oxborrow asked if he will need the kitchen. Candy said no, he has a full setup. Judy Davis asked if Kiwanis can do lunch for exhibitors. Candy said they do not want to feed the public. The vendor would make a deal with us to charge for the judges separately from whatever he does in the park. We have only had one food vendor and we should probably have two. Carolyn suggested that if we have two different food vendors, they should offer different menus.

Candy hasn't talked to Wayne directly but Dennis Johnson said Wayne is available for parking. Same cost as last show \$5 per rig; if they do the early morning parking lot, \$5.50 per rig and they would help keep small parking lot cleaned out.

Tracy Gunter is willing to be Grounds Chairman but he will not pick up after exhibitors and take care of all their trash. We need someone specifically to do trash. Jennifer Moxley asked if Boy Scouts would be willing to help? Elaine Oxborrow said it is still too early to ask her person that does pooper scooping. 4-H helped out last show and can maybe help out again this year. Boy Scouts can earn badges by helping out by assisting with unloading and such for the exhibitors. Candy mentioned the Catholic church has teenagers that as part of their confirmation have to do community service. Candy will get in touch with them.

Elaine Oxborrow asked about the bathrooms. We don't know yet if bathrooms will be available. If the bathrooms are available, we should hire a janitorial service. Judy Davis mentioned that the high school band can be an option. Another option is ROTC. Candy will contact people to see who we can get to help out.

Candy talked with Dennis Johnson and asked how entries have been. He said they have only done one show on the west coast in the past year. Candy will get back to him in the middle of April after there have been more shows. Jennifer said that Las Vegas reached their limit of 1000 entries within days of the opening. Carolyn said that based on our shows through the years we should limit our entry to no more than 1200 entries because we really don't have the room for more. Candy will discuss limiting entries with Dennis.

Thea will do CGC, CGCA and Trick Dog again. She has some items but will send what else she will need. Candy said the area near the gazebo will be roped off for them.

Trophy Committee:

Vikki Jaramillo needs at least \$500.00 more for trophies. She thinks that would be enough. One bill is outstanding to Lexine and she has two more to give to her. Vikki found tote bags for \$4.85 each; passed around samples. She found key fobs for \$6.00-\$7.00 each for Winners Dog and Winners Bitch. She found good deals on fabric in several breeds at \$5.00. Yvonne Roscoe will be making pillows and wall hangings out of the fabric. After more tote bags 90% of breed trophies should be covered. Elaine Oxborrow asked specifically what the tote bags were covering. Vikki said it depends on the entry. It may be BOB, BOW, WD, WB but not OS. If it is a large entry it will cover WD, WB as well as BOB. Not all breeds will get all those trophies. Vikki is basing it on past entries so if there is a breed with one dog there would only be BOB but if there is a larger entry it may be BOB, WD, WB or BOW. Vikki said it is for both Saturday and Sunday. She explained it is dealing with two years because we had no show in 2020. Carolyn said if you are having a BOW there really isn't a need for WD or WB since one of those will be getting BOW. One dog would get three trophies if they get WD, BOW and BOB.

Judy Davis said that with the \$415.00 bill, making it \$500.00 would give \$85.00 more for trophies. Judy made a motion to approve \$500.00 more for trophies, second, Sharon White. Lexine said this is the first time we have approved money for trophies and for future years if we approve for example \$1000.00 for trophies, anything else needs to come from the membership. Vikki said that in the beginning \$1500.00 was mentioned but she felt we should start with \$1000 with the understanding that more may be needed. Lexine feels membership needs to step up more to help with this. Some members donate every show to the group winner in lieu of an actual breed trophy. Vikki and Yvonne have done an amazing job. Vikki said if members see anything even if it isn't their breed please get it to her. There are still more items such as pillow stuffing and easels that need to be purchased. Vikki said anything over the \$500.00 she would cover personally. Motion to give Vikki and Yvonne up to \$500.00 more for trophies. Motion carried.

No other Committee reports

New Members:

Francie McKown had her third reading for membership. She is from Minden and has a Golden Retriever. Francie was voted unanimously as a member. Jennifer Moxley had her second reading. She is from Gardnerville and has Parson Russell Terriers, Portuguese Podengos and recently added a Labrador puppy as a bird dog for her husband.

Unfinished Business:

Candy said we can get the Port Authority polo shirts (minimum 15) and sell to club members for \$20.00-25.00 to cover the cost. Fee to clean up logo \$80.00 and a \$25.00 one-time charge for the artwork set-up. If we order 15 to would be \$331.66. Francie asked which company. Candy said it is Stith. Cindy got quotes from three companies and this was the best. Francie mentioned that Silver State Industries has Port Authority for \$15.00 and there was no set-up fee or logo charge. There aren't any conformation shows July 24th or 31st weekends. Candy asked who will be match chairman, no one offered. The date chosen for the match was July 31st and Elaine Oxborrow said maybe we could get other groups to participate like TMDTC, and maybe Carrie Dempsey for agility. Thea Tsurumoto will check schedules with other clubs. Motion by Ann Kinney to hold match on July 31st second by Thea. Motion passed unanimously.

Ann asked when the July meeting will be held. We will probably have the regular meeting at the Community Center.

Sunday 3/21 "Maverick" was WD & BOW for 2 points! Tibbie "Jordan" was select.

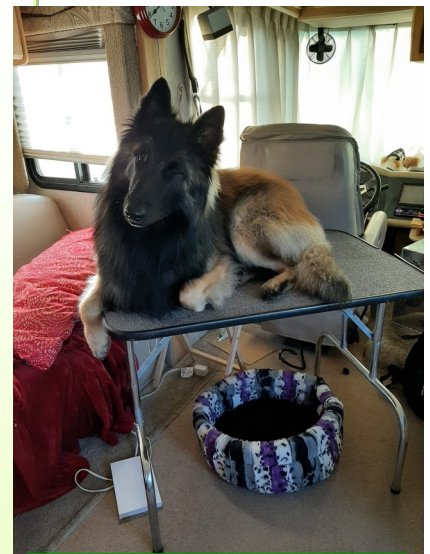
Thursday 3/25 at San Mateo KC "Maverick" was BOW for 1 point.

Hope I got these all straight! **Congratulations!**



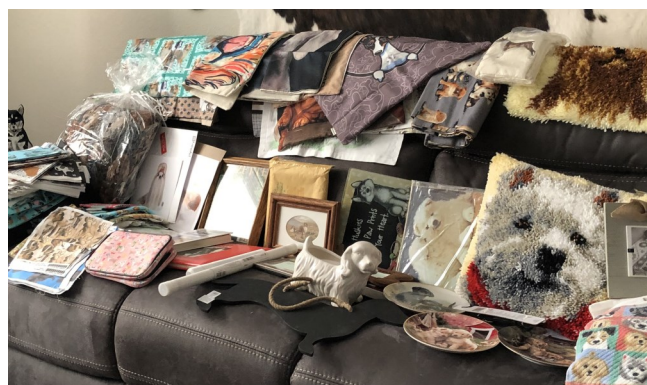
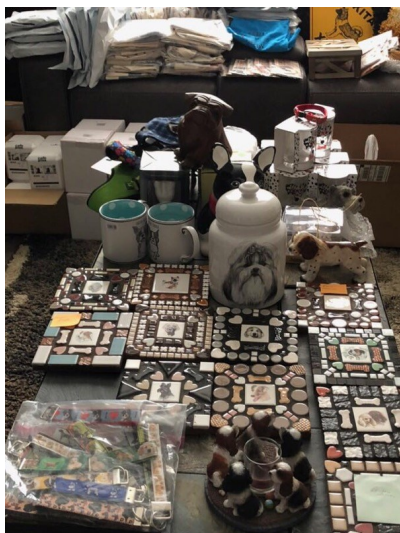

Bonanza Kennel Club Board Meeting Minutes March 16, 2021

Board meeting called to order on Zoom by President Candy Roper at 6:36 p.m.

Board members in attendance: Candy Roper-President, Bob Kinney-Vice President, Lexine Thompson-Treasurer/Recording Secretary, Yvonne Roscoe-Corresponding Secretary, Elaine Oxborrow-Board Member, Vikki Jaramillo-Board Member.

Candy discussed the decision to restrict Board Meeting attendance to Board Members for the time being. Due to the pandemic for the past year, we have been unable to meet or conduct business. We now need to be able to concentrate on what has to be done to get restarted. This will expedite the process. Candy took a poll of the Board. Every member approves restricting attendance until further notice. Any member who has an issue that they want to present to the Board can submit a request and the Board will send an invitation. Minutes will be in the newsletter.

Motion Elaine Oxborrow, second Vikki Jaramillo, to approve board minutes from January 18, 2020 as printed in the January 2020 newsletter. Motion passed unanimously.

Secretary reports:

None

Treasurer report:

Lexine Thompson reported no changes since the March General Meeting.

Committees

Show:

Candy reported we lost two judges we had to replace. We didn't have anyone else who could do the Herding Group. A couple judges this year will only have travel and meal expenses as they are delegates. Another will cut their fee if we give them all of their provisional breeds. We had to hire two judges to fill the holes from losing judges. Everyone is hired now. The only thing that might change that is if the Biewer Terrier National Specialty decide to join us this year. We will know if they're coming after they meet on April 16th. Candy sent them quite a bit of information. The Belgian Tervuren, Belgian Sheepdogs, Papillons, and German Shorthaired Pointers will have Specialties on Friday. The Rottweiler club will not be here but Shelties will be coming.

We need to hire an announcer this year, someone with a strong voice that will keep everyone reminded of the current restrictions. Candy emailed Matthew Davis to see who they use but hasn't received an answer yet. If you know anyone that would be good, please let Candy know.

Candy spoke with Elaine Bergenheier a couple days ago about our covid plans. She found a statement in a premium that says "The Show Chair has the right to change the rules according to what the COVID rules are at the time of the show" Elaine felt it was a good statement to add to our premium. Candy asked her if we need to do a presentation to the Health Department for our match like we are doing for the show. Elaine felt it may be a good idea to do a presentation to them. It will show we are making the effort to be compliant. Elaine has a meeting with the Director of the Board of Health next week and she will let us know what happens.

Candy asked Vikki and Yvonne about trophies. Every breed will have a BOB trophy. Breeds that have a larger entry might have BOW or WD/WB. We have spent \$1500 from the club with approximately \$85 left, as well as a private donation from Marian Panter in the amount of \$200 making the total spent \$1700. Elaine asked what the original budget was from the club. Lexine reported that \$1000 was the original amount with the caveat that there may be more if needed. An additional \$500 was approved at the last meeting. Vikki is hoping that she can keep what's left to do under the \$500 recently approved and not use some of the \$85. Elaine asked if all the trophies are now bought. Vikki said no that they would pick up the slack for everything else. There aren't many more BOB trophies left to get. Elaine asked if we have generic trophies should an odd or miscellaneous breed enter. Vikki said no. Candy has a black coffee cup with a gold logo that was donated back recently. Carolyn Goepner found a couple of bags of windsocks that we used years ago that can be used for generic trophies. We should at least have the windsocks at the shows in case they are needed. Vikki said she and Yvonne will be picking up the costs of anything left once the funds run out. Elaine's said that Vikki and Yvonne have done a phenomenal job on trophies but she has concerns that they are working so hard that they could get to a point this won't be fun. Vikki didn't agree! Elaine said she won't approve any more money for trophies, but if Vikki and Yvonne are spending their own money for club trophies, that isn't right. Vikki said this big expense will be only for this year as it is a comeback year. Next year will be totally different, it won't be on the same scale. Elaine still doesn't feel it's fair for them to have to pay out of pocket but the club shouldn't put more money out, so it's a Catch 22. Vikki said they are doing their contribution in both money and time. Vikki is pretty much finished with her part but

Yvonne's is just beginning with the sewing and such. Vikki said if they aren't complaining then no one else should. Lexine asked about the specialties. When she did her National trophies, they also covered the two supported shows. The club that put on the all-breed shows didn't do trophies because the Tibetan Spaniel Club supplied them. Are we making sure that we aren't doubling up by doing trophies for the specialty shows? Vikki said what they give, they give. They come to our shows, so we provide trophies. Some of the items for Tervs and Sheepdogs have been donated by individuals, like vintage books for BOW. Lexine asked if those are being included and if those breeds then are being doubled up on? Lexine said her National club did trophies and the all-breed clubs didn't give anything. Vikki believes that what is being done this year is how it was done at the 2018 or 2019 show or both. Elaine said that Vikki and Yvonne are integral to our club and she wants to make sure they don't get overwhelmed and we lose them. We need to revisit trophies for the 2022 show.

We have to list all the trophies in the premium and that increases the cost. Candy said it will cost about an extra \$300 for the premium list. Candy will ask MBF for generic wording that can be used to save space. Pages have to be added in increments of 4 so we can't just add one page at a time. It costs us \$75/page. Vikki said wording can say something like "unless otherwise specified trophies will be sponsored by Bonanza Kennel Club" then add specific people with what they personally donate. Lexine mentioned she doesn't go to a show for the trophy although it is nice to get. Vikki and Yvonne have done a great job and it's like a National. Vikki said Carolyn had something in embroidery and wants to talk to her. Elaine said Carolyn has an embroidery machine and will have her get in touch.

Vikki wanted to confirm we are having obedience and rally both days of the show. Yes, we are.

Match Committee:

Candy has reserved Fuji Park for the July 31 match and the gazebo for the BBQ. Elaine will follow-up with TMDTC to see if they will be there. We should invite Quicksilver Agility. Elaine thinks it is a good idea and will get in touch with Carrie Dempsey. Candy said if Quicksilver doesn't come, Thea Tsurumoto has some equipment and will set up a fun run. Lexine will talk to 4-H. Lexine asked if there could be a mixed breed class. AKC doesn't allow that but they can do obedience and agility. Candy said if anyone has a dog they would let a 4-H kid handle, that would work. Hopefully we will have conformation, agility and obedience. Candy said we still need a match chairman. Elaine said she can probably do it. Candy will submit the application so it is in for AKC approval. Candy said if we make the entries available through Pay Pal we need to add \$1.00. Do we want to just make it \$6.00 on the flyer? It is a reasonable cost and will make it easy and maybe more people will enter. They don't have to come as early so that may be a draw.

Do we want to make the BBQ a potluck or picnic bring your own because of restrictions? Lexine asked if it could be decided later. Candy said the governor thinks by July 4th we may be fairly back to normal. Vikki said maybe the flyer could say bring your own as a new normal. The flyer won't be done for awhile so we can wait on this.

We will need hand sanitizer for the tables. We don't need to do that now but we need to be ready.

No other committee business.

Old Business: None

New Business:

In regards to meetings, Parks department typically won't let you have two events in the same month. The Match is July 31st and the meeting would be July 6th. Should we just cancel the July meeting or do a Zoom meeting? We don't have to decide now but we do need to address it before long. The August meeting is three days after the match. Are we going to go back and have a BBQ or just have the meeting in August at the Community Center? We agreed to have it at the Community Center.

In the January 2020 Standing Rules we agreed we would have the October meeting the second Tuesday in the month so keep that in mind since the show is October 2 & 3. Meeting will be October 11th.
