Meeting called to order by President Candy Roper at 7:20 p.m.

Motion by Vikki Jaramillo, second Nancy Hurwitz, to approve March 2, 2021 minutes as printed in the March newsletter. Motion passed unanimously.

Motion by Vikki second by Marion Panter to approve March 16, 2021 minutes as printed in the March newsletter. Motion passed unanimously.

Secretary reports:

No Recording Secretary report.

Corresponding Secretary Yvonne Roscoe not present but Vikki Jaramillo reported that Yvonne received several items that she wanted to share. 1) A postcard from Abby Labby Lanterns, pricey for the club. 2) Ad from author William R. Vitanyi who has written two books, one is The Human Society about a show Papillon and how it becomes humanlike. He also wrote about the purpose of dog clubs and dog shows. 3) USDA Impact Report which is very lengthy but basically about the challenges with COVID. 4) Article "How did the French Bulldog become number 2 ranked" available on the AKC website. 5) Noteworthy News from Dennis Sprung, President and CEO of AKC, where he talks about COVID and continuing assisting clubs as they safely return to live events. He gives statistics on how the shows are down compared to 2019 but they are slowly coming back as are agility trials. 6) "At Risk Best Practices" which is two-fold. It is a mission statement for at risk situations and the other is helping dog owners minimize risk through advanced preparation. Goes on to define people / breeders who can't keep their dogs for any reason and how a club can assist with these issues. Vikki will send all links to Candy to forward to the membership.

Treasurer Report:

Lexine Thompson reported the beginning balance was \$33,816.20 with expenses of \$476.95 and no income for an ending balance of \$33,339.25.

Show Committee:

Candy said we need a show announcer to keep reminding exhibitors about COVID rules that need to be followed. Candy received an email from a friend that said Larry Bitner might be interested. She will contact him and find out if he is interested / available. Candy has wanted someone to announce groups for quite some time so this would be nice to be able to have that as well. Larry has done the Sheltie National, so he is experienced. Candy will contact the Carson City Symphony to see if they can do the National Anthem again. Hopefully John will be able to sing for us.

Candy hasn't contacted the Catholic church or Boy Scouts for help yet, but it is on her list.

Sunshine Committee:

Carolyn Goepner is not present but Candy reported that Sharon White had a stroke followed by a heart attack. She is home and mending. Candy will ask Carolyn to send flowers or a plant to her. New Members:

Jennifer Moxley has her third reading for membership tonight. She is from Gardnerville and has Parson Russell Terriers, Portuguese Podengos, and Labradors. She is waiting for a Podengo litter to be born tonight. She has shown for over 25 years and was the Vice President and Trophy Chairman for Lake Matthews Kennel Club. Jennifer was voted in unanimously. Jennifer said next meeting there will be a new person coming with her from California that has Sloughis.

Unfinished Business:

Candy said that she talked with the company doing the club shirts to make sure the costs were still the same since we've had the quote for a while. The cost for shirts to the club is still \$15.00 each with XXL \$2.00 more and XXXL \$3.00 more. The polo shirts will be green with a white logo. They can do white shirts and green logo but that would mean club members would not be easily recognized at the show. It will cost \$40.00 to clean up the logo, one-time \$20.00 cost to get film positive and \$25.00 for screen set-up. If we charge \$20-\$25 per shirt we should be able to recoup the one-time setup costs of \$85.00. Motion Cindra Smith, second Jennifer Moxley, to order club shirts. The motion passed unanimously. Candy will send an email to members to see how many to order.

New Business:

Candy received info from a previous judge about a judge gift bag with candies, lotion, face masks, sanitizer, etc. Candy would like to do this for our judges because they have stuck with us through the pandemic. She put together a list of items to include and also talked to the company doing our shirts. They have a beige canvas bag available with our green logo on it at \$12.00 each (based on 25 bags). Candy looked on Amazon for items like wrinkle relief spray, lotion, individually wrapped face masks, Kleenex packets, hand wipes, chap stick, etc. She ordered note pads that she is donating. We have plenty of pens to share. The cost comes to \$393.54 without sales tax which includes the cost of the bags. Each "stuffed" bag would cost us \$28.00 if we order items from Amazon. We need 16 bags in case we have to hire a couple extra judges due to high entries. If we sell the extra (empty) canvas bags to club members (quantity 9-11) for \$20.00 each, we would make up half of what we would spend on this. Selling 9 bags at \$20.00 each would bring in \$180.00.

Candy passed around a picture of paw print key fobs that a lady in Reno makes and a picture of the bag. She ordered some of the key fobs for the judges which Candy will donate. Jennifer suggested going to the Dollar Store for some of the items and said that at her National you got a goody bag when you picked up your registration. Candy said we used to do bags for overnight RV parking and it was really popular. The Chamber of Commerce gave us plastic bags and we put Nevada brochures, bottles of water, garbage bags, dog food samples, and some pet supply companies donated product samples. Jennifer suggested we make a list that members can sign up to buy some items to donate. Candy will put together a list and ask for donations. Motion Marion Panter, second Jennifer Moxley, to order the bags for judge goody bags. Motion passed unanimously.

Vikki asked about food vendors at the show. She said that Sissy's Burgers has a truck that has BBQ items. Vikki will get the number and give it to Candy. Some felt Paradise was slow. Candy said that at the last meeting she mentioned the guy from Kiwanis that has Hillbilly Chili. He has chili dogs, garlic fries, chili fries, different items on the menu that Tasters Paradise has except maybe hamburgers. Hillbilly Chili wants to come to the show.

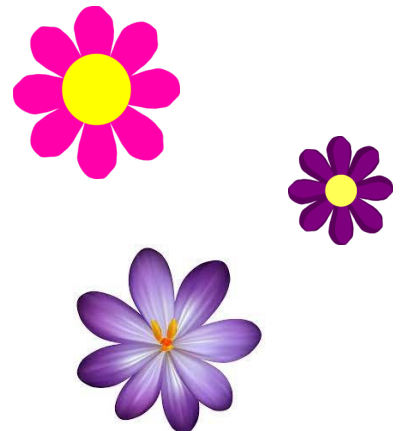


"Paisley"

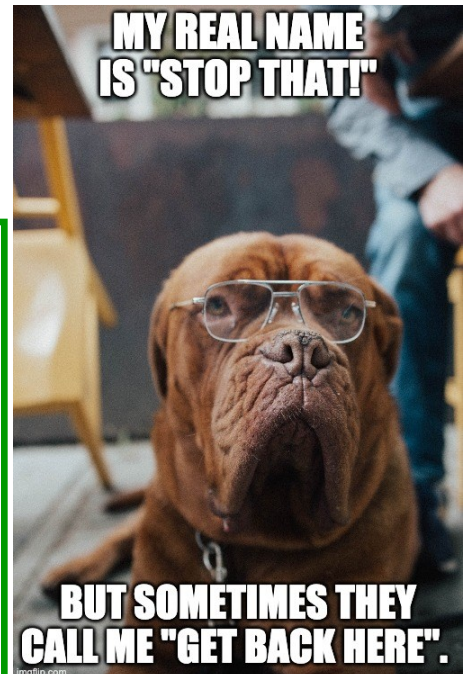

It is with great sadness and report that we report the passing of former professional handler and American Kennel Club Executive Field Representative, Sue Vroom of Texas.

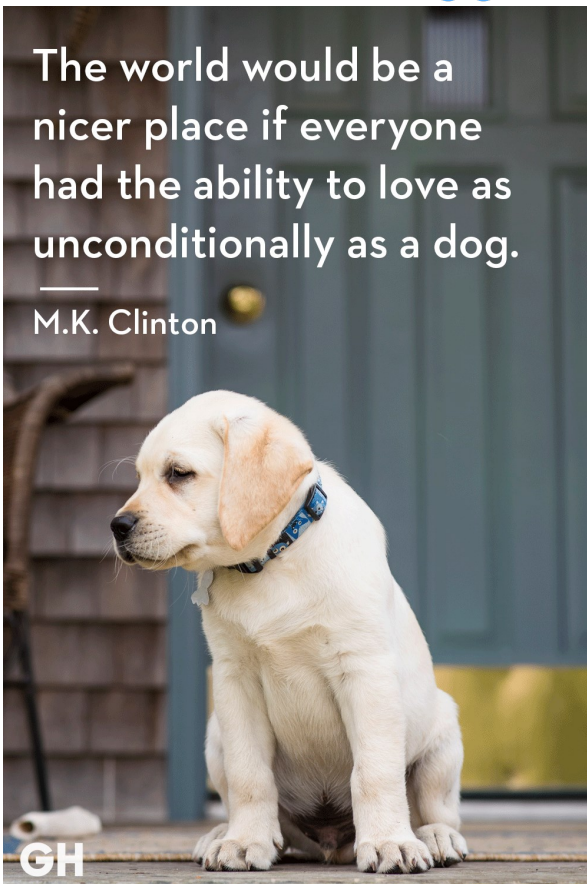
