Here we are – time for another show & we're facing a new crisis. The Caldor Fire has caused a disaster for this area in so many ways. So many people have lost their homes. Some amazing wilderness has been destroyed. Wildlife has been displaced, injured, or killed. Air quality is a disaster everywhere. If you haven't heard already, Fuji Park has been an evacuation center & has been full. I talked with the Parks Department on Friday & **most** evacuees have been moved to Reno. That does not mean that Fuji Park is free & clear for the shows yet, but it's a step in the right direction! We are playing it by ear at the moment. If they can save South Lake Tahoe & the Kingsbury area, we might be OK to proceed. There is another thing to watch – air quality. Can we hold an outdoor event in air as bad as what we're having? If they get the fire under control as soon as they are saying, we should be OK. We are watching closely. As of right now **THE SHOWS ARE A GO**. We will discuss everything at the meeting on Tuesday.

Because the Community Center is also an evacuation center, the meeting on Tuesday, September 7, has been moved to the Carson City Senior Center at 911 Beverly Drive. **You need to use the EAST parking lot at the Senior Center!** When you approach the entry doors, if they don't open automatically, you're not in the right lot! We'll meet in the Joshua Tree Room which is just inside the east entrance. There's a map attached at the end of the newsletter.

## General Meeting Minutes - August 3, 2021

Meeting called to order by President Candy Roper at 7:12 p.m.

Motion Vikki Jaramillo, second Marian Panter, to accept the June 2021 minutes as printed in the newsletter. Motion passed unanimously.

### Secretary reports:

Corresponding Secretary, Yvonne Roscoe brought contact information for Sissy's BBQ as a possible vendor for the show.

No Recording Secretary report.

### Treasurer report:

Lexine Thompson reported the beginning balance was \$33,119.41 with expenses and income of (\$244.90) for an ending balance of \$32,874.51.

The July 31<sup>st</sup> match was a success with a net income was around \$300. Pay Pal fees were about \$18 which was worth the cost as it would have taken a long time to do the day of match entries. We had 46 pre-entries and 15 day of match entries which are the most we have had in many years. There were very nice dogs entered and many breeds represented. Truckee Meadows Dog Training Club offered CGC and CGCA with 25 CGC entries and 3 CGCA entries. We also offered agility fun runs with at least 28 entries. It was good to add those to our conformation match. Hopefully we can continue to do this. We may be able to add more activities as well. Cindra mentioned there were a lot of walk-up people asking what was happening. Some decided to try agility.

Elaine Oxborrow thanked everyone for the help. It was the first time in many years there was enough help. Thank you to Nancy Lovelady and Rene Harris for judging, as well as those who helped.

### Committees

#### Show Committee:

Candy is plugging along. The premium will be published online August 16<sup>th</sup> with entries opening August 19<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 a.m. PDT. Entries are limited to 1,200 per day for conformation and 8 hours judging time each for obedience and rally, based on our parking limits. Reno Kennel Club said as of July 31<sup>st</sup> they were at approximately 1200 entries.

Candy Roper, Elaine Bergenheier, and Lexine Thompson met with Parks and Recreation a week ago. Most things remain the same however there is a limit on the size of canopies to 10X10 with no stakes in the grass. You can put canopies side by side to make them bigger. This year Parks is not offering the electric boxes and cords for RV's so we will have to rent them. Parks charged \$15/per spider box (including 4 drop cords each) so hopefully we can find a comparable cost. We need 15-20 boxes. Candy contacted a place in Reno and they quoted \$10/per box which would be about \$216 for the weekend but they don't include cords. Candy will check with Parks to make sure they are what we need. Another company quoted over \$2000 for the weekend.

Candy found a janitorial service that will charge \$50/hour. She is waiting for a written quote. They would do a deep clean at night and twice on Friday and three times Saturday and Sunday during the day. Other companies have not responded at this time. Parks requires the company to be licensed and bonded. They require a licensed company, not individuals, to do the cleaning.

Porta potties at the match were terrible. They were supposed to be cleaned on Thursday. Neither had been cleaned and dumped and they didn't have toilet paper. Thankfully we brought some just in case. Candy contacted Parks to let them know.

Bonanza T-shirt order is going in Thursday so if anyone wants to order, it needs to be done prior to that. The minimum order has been reached. We also have the tote bags that can be ordered. They are being used for judges gift bags, but we will have extras if anyone is interested.

#### Sunshine Committee:

Bob Kinney was at the match and said radiation has been hard but he is doing ok.

JB & Lexine Thompson lost their Tibbie "Wizard" yesterday. He was almost 17 years old.

Vikki was a canine ambassador back east and used to educate kids about dogs.

Candy mentioned we need to do more education at schools, especially now that we have more members. There was discussion regarding where our membership resides and the percentage of members needed for a quorum. Nancy Lovelady said there is an AKC template that shows you can have 10% of active members. We didn't have a July meeting on Zoom because we were short one person. This meeting was just enough present to have the meeting. We need to do some amendments by the end of the year. The question was asked what associate members are. They can't vote nor are they counted towards a quorum. Jennifer asked about the number of board members. We currently have 7 positions with two being held by Lexine. She asked why only two come to meetings. Candy explained that when there is a board meeting, we always have enough attend. We have had a lack of new members for many years and in recent years have started getting new people. Cindra Smith said some meetings are a challenge due to member's location and weather. Candy has asked members to look on our website to see what bylaws need to be changed or added. We need to add the ability to do Zoom meetings. It needs to be updated by the end of the year. We need to do an analysis to see where the members live and ability to get to a meeting. We have lost some major knowledge and history with Sieg and Bob gone now. They were both in the club since almost the beginning and with the loss of Sieg and his doing grounds at our show we are really in a quandary.

# What Is Ataxia in Dogs?

## The Different Types of Ataxia in Dogs

Poor balance, falling, or a change in the way your dog walks could be caused by a condition called ataxia. Although any dog can develop ataxia, some breeds are at higher risk.

### What Are the Symptoms of Ataxia?

Symptoms vary depending on the type of ataxia. If your dog loses its balance easily, develops gait issues, or shakes, the symptoms could be caused by one of these three forms of the condition:

**Vestibular Ataxia.** Vestibular ataxia occurs due to a problem with your dog's brainstem or the inner ear. These structures control balance and your pet's movements. Vestibular ataxia can be caused by injuries or infections, including ear infections. Other causes can include nerve degeneration, inflammation, antibiotics, hypothyroidism, fungal infections, poisoning, or cancer.

**Vestibular Ataxia Symptoms.** Dogs that have ataxia may fall, have difficulty walking, walk in circles, or tilt their heads. You may notice that your dog's eyes flutter side to side or up and down. Vestibular ataxia can make your dog feel dizzy and nauseated and may cause vomiting.

**Proprioceptive (Sensory) Ataxia.** Proprioceptive ataxia occurs due to compression of your dog's spinal cord. Your dog may develop this form of ataxia due to a blood clot, spinal infection or inflammation, tumor, cyst, or blood clot. It may also be related to defects or abnormalities in your dog's spine, an unstable spine, or narrowing of the canal that the spinal cord passes through.

**Proprioceptive Ataxia Symptoms.** It's difficult for a dog with proprioceptive ataxia to determine the exact placement of its limbs and body. This can make it hard for your dog to figure out where to move its feet when walking. In addition to an awkward gait, signs of proprioceptive ataxia can also include weakness and wobbling when walking or standing.

**Cerebellar Ataxia.** Cerebellar Ataxia can be caused by changes or abnormalities in the cerebellum, the part of the brain that coordinates your pet's movements and helps your dog balance. Other causes may include heart disease, a brain infection or inflammation, a brain tumor, a toxic reaction to an antibiotic, respiratory disease, red blood cell count issues, or lower-than-normal amounts of glucose, potassium, or calcium.

**Cerebellar Ataxia Symptoms.** Dogs that have cerebellar ataxia may shake and sway. Your dog might stagger, adopt an unusual walking style, or fall or stumble when turning. Shaking or moving its head might make your dog feel so dizzy that it falls. You may also notice unusual eye movements, either side to side or up and down. Russell, Toy Fox, Parson Russell, Smooth Fox, Tenterfield, and Jack Russell terriers may be more likely to develop cerebellar ataxia, according to the Orthopedic Foundation for Animals.

### How Is Ataxia Treated?

Your pet's veterinarian will need to perform a few tests to determine the cause of your dog's condition. These tests may include blood work, urine tests, X-rays, ultrasound, computed tomography (CT), or magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) scans.

Treating underlying issues, like infections or hypothyroidism, may help improve your pet's balance and stop the symptoms. Unfortunately, it's not always possible to cure ataxia. If that's the case, your veterinarian can prescribe medications or provide suggestions that will improve your pet's comfort and decrease the risk of injury.
