This month has flown by and I suddenly find myself frantically trying to get everything together that needs to be done "right now"! We have our upcoming meeting (Tuesday), we need to start gathering information for the premium list, and the Reno Pet Show ... It's all coming way too fast!

The Reno Pet Show is March 25-27. It is part of Al Lockett's Reno Expo 2022. They forgot to let us know they **are** holding it this year. The Expo includes RVs, boats, home / garden, travel, sports, and pet shows. It has been many years since we attended this show, but we were always **well received**. The Expo draws about 25,000 people over the course of the week. The Pet Show is the last 3 days. **We need volunteers to man the booth!** Those volunteers need to have well socialized dogs that they can bring with them for people to meet. We try to have 2 breeds of dogs available in the booth at any time throughout the day. We have some AKC brochures but not enough because AKC no longer gives bulk copies to clubs. This show takes a **lot** of manpower. Dogs are in the booth for 2-3 hours, then new dogs come in. If we are low on manpower, we will have to make those shifts 3-4 hours. **I need help people!** There's not a lot of time. We need members to order more public education kits from AKC so that we can have as many brochures as possible.

We need to start thinking about our summer B-Match. We can hold it on our "traditional" date of "the Saturday after the Fourth of July" (the 9th) this year as it will not conflict with the TMDTC trials. Do we have a volunteer as Match Chairman?

The Constitution & Bylaws were sent to everyone a couple weeks ago with the revisions from the January meeting. We have one question we need to clarify with the membership at the meeting on Tuesday. Beyond that, we will be voting yes or no on the changes. These need to go to AKC right away.

Lexine is working on information for the membership list that the club voted to provide to members. You will be hearing from her soon to gather the information you want shared.

Bonanza Kennel Club General Meeting Minutes January 4, 2022

Meeting called to order by Treasurer, Lexine Thompson at 7:03 p.m.

Motion Carolyn Goepner, second Nancy Lovelady, to accept the November 2, 2021, General meeting minutes as printed in the November newsletter. Motion passed unanimously.

Motion Carolyn Goepner, second Nancy Hurwitz, to accept the December 6, 2021, Board meeting minutes as printed in the December newsletter. Motion passed unanimously.

President report: None

Secretary reports:

Yvonne Roscoe, Corresponding Secretary, sent Christmas cards to all our judges from the October show.

Treasurer report:

Lexine Thompson reported the beginning balance was \$32,181.37 with income of \$2,997.31 and expenses of \$771.37 for an ending balance of \$34,407.31.

Lexine Thompson reported the show income based on calendar year as well as fiscal year as they are different dates. Calendar year show income was \$28,628.70 with expenses of \$28,411.19 adding back the expenses of trophies from the previous calendar year for the 2020 show that didn't happen in the amount of \$1,018.95 for a net loss of \$801.44. We still have some income that is still outstanding for hotel rooms from specialty clubs which will probably make the net a small income. Based on fiscal year, the income was \$28,628.70 with expenses of \$27,897.77 adding back trophies paid for prior to April 1, 2021, of \$1,632.18 net loss is \$901.25.

The annual report for the calendar year has income of \$31,340.04 and expenses of \$31,288.13 for a net income of \$51.91. the annual report for the fiscal year has income of \$31,126.04 and expenses of \$30,105.91 for a net income of \$1,020.13.

Nancy Lovelady asked how this show compared to the 2019 show. Lexine explained the last show was an unusual year with net income of approximately \$11,000. This year there were more expenses overall with less entries as well as janitorial fees, electrical box fees, professional stewards etc. In 2019 we had less in judges fees as a few were local. Our usual net income is \$2,000 or less.

Committees

Show Committee:

Nothing new. No news regarding Fuji Park. Candy will contact them this week. Show application has been submitted to AKC.

The trophies were a big hit at the 2021 shows. We received a **LOT** of compliments on them. The Board voted we set the total budget at \$1,500 for Vikki Jaramillo and Yvonne Roscoe to buy trophies for the 2022 shows. Members need to step up and contribute! A recommended amount would be \$25.00 - \$30.00 for Best of Breed. Vikki said if your breed is already covered, the money can be used for another breed.

The Board voted to offer NOHS on Saturday only again because AKC has changed the NOHS year. We're now at the beginning of the NOHS year instead of the end. People do NOT hang around our shows on Sunday, they're in a big hurry to get over the mountains in case a storm hits. We'll revisit the issue after our second show with NOHS in 2022 happens.

We need to start getting things together so we have what we need for the premium, the deadline will be here before you know it.

Nancy Lovelady asked if we will be offering the new AKC rule allowing a bred-by split for puppies. Lexine said that the rule wasn't in effect at the time of the Board meeting. It will need to be discussed.

Ballots were counted by Ann Kinney, Marian Panter, and Thea Tsurumoto. The results are:

New Members:

Terri Dickerson had her third reading. She has Miniature American Shepherds. She does CGC training as well as agility and rally in her indoor arena. She also has barn hunt training that is taught by Liz Carter. She has trials and barn hunt tests there. Her place is not appropriate for a dog show, but she could hold matches there. Terri was voted on and accepted unanimously as a new member.

Unfinished Business:

Discussion regarding the changing of the Bylaws. Only items that were changed based on membership input are listed. All other changes were emailed prior to the meeting to membership for review and were agreed on at the meeting.

Constitution: Article I, Section 2 a) Add "AKC" before purebred dogs.

Article I, Section 3 Was discussed as to allowing members to be given gifts for extra work i.e., conformation classes. It was voted to leave as in the bylaws not allowing gifts to members by the club.

Bylaws: Article II, Section 5 Add the words "and absentee" after proxy. Added "postal balloting or" before electronic voting in amendment to this section.

Elaine Bergenheier expressed concern for zoom meeting and have to be present to vote. A vote was taken. The majority voted to keep as written in the revised Bylaws stating you must be present to vote.

Article II Section 6 Added, allowing electronic, virtual, and teleconference meetings, and attendance at those meetings. Add "one way" after 45 miles. Also remove the "such as a current health situation".

Article III, Section 2 f) Discussion on how many meetings a member must attend before becoming an Officer. It was decided four meetings for a member and six meetings for Board members. Membership voted to remove "In order to serve as an Officer, a member must first serve one (1) term as a Director."

Article IV, Section 1 The fiscal year will remain April 1 through March 31.

Article IV, Section 4 d) Additional method for nominating a member for an office if they cannot attend the November meeting. Changed to allow an email of acceptance of a nomination from the floor, sent to the Recording Secretary prior to the start of the November meeting.

There was discussion regarding term limits and voted to not have term limits.

New Business:

There was discussion to have a membership list sent to club members. Lexine asked what information members would like i.e. breeds, special skills, etc. Motion made by Judy Davis, second Elaine Bergenheier, to distribute a list to all members once a year, near or at the annual meeting, and give to new members. Motion passed unanimously.

Motion to adjourn Ann Kinney at 9:20 p.m.

Joseph E. Gregory pens an open letter to the fancy before his death at age 93

Joseph E. Gregory

July 18, 1927 - January 17, 2022

Dear Friends,

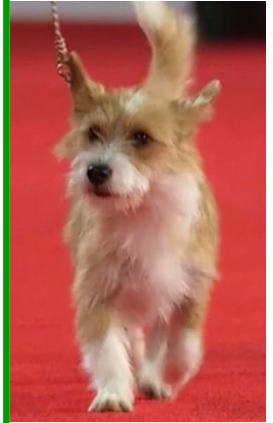

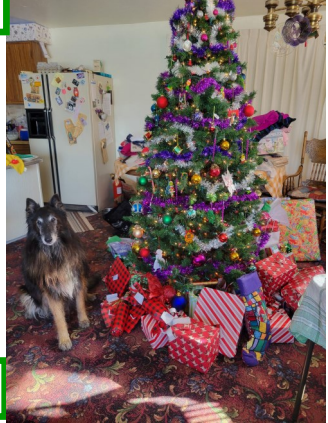

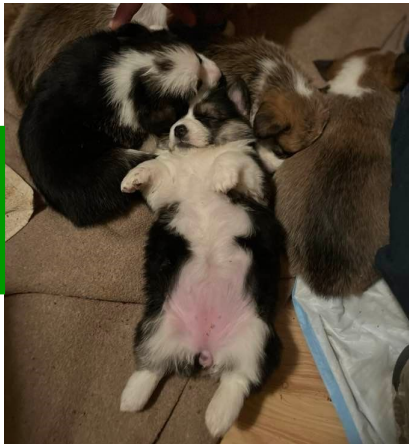

Senate Bill 103: Prohibiting dog breed discrimination from insurance companies

RENO, Nev. (KOLO) - Dog owners with certain breed types now have fewer challenges to face when it comes to housing and insurance. Dogs like Pit Bulls, German Shepherds, or any large breed of dog are traditionally not accepted in apartments or affordable housing.

[Senate Bill 103](#) now states, "Insurers will no longer be able to use a breed of a dog to refuse to issue; cancel; refuse to renew; or increase the premium or rate of a policy of insurance based on a specific breed of dog or mixture of breed of dogs."

Before this bill went into effect the first of the year, dog owners would either have to find a property that accepts their pet, pay additional insurance costs, or in some cases have to surrender their dog to a shelter.

Rebecca Goff, the Clinical Manager at the Nevada Humane Society shared what this bill means when it comes to their shelter.

"I was able to testify at the different hearings about this bill and how this bill would benefit the Nevada Humane Society and our community as a whole. We're here to serve the homeless animals of our community, we're here to serve the people of our community. Our goal is to help keep animals with their families and this bill is going to help do that," Goff said.

Christian Pacheco is a dog owner of a Pit Bull in the Reno area, and finding a place to live that accepted his dog was a challenge he faced this past year. Pacheco explained what the process was like for him.

"I had to put my dog above anything else while finding a complex that accepts him. It's a little pricier in comparison to other complexes, you know the money is a huge part playing into finding a home," Pacheco said.

An insurance company is still able to refuse, increase, or cancel a dog owner's insurance in the case that the dog is dangerous or vicious. Insurers must now have that language in their policies and can still have the option to not consider a dog on their property as well.

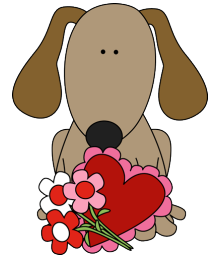
