President's Message

March has been a busy month for us, and April is shaping up to be another busy one! We recently received word from the Parks Department that there will be a Board of Supervisors meeting on April 7 (Carson City Community Center) that will discuss the proposed master plan for Fuji Park. We don't know what time it is yet, they said we will not be able to get that information until three days prior to the meeting. We are working on a presentation as some of the changes will be detrimental to dog shows. If you are available to be in the audience that day, that would be great! We will have to watch the Board of Supervisors website for information on the time.

We have received *numerous* questions from members over the past 10 days. Because there have been so many, I am going to address several of them here.

When will I get the meeting minutes? As always, minutes are included in the newsletter, which is sent out prior to our monthly membership meeting.

Is there an agenda for the meeting? The agenda is in the back of the Bylaws. We follow that guideline as our agenda.

Do we have insurance for shows / matches? Yes we do. We have a policy that covers our events at Fuji Park. It is provided to the Parks Department annually. Our meeting location is also covered, as are other events / locations as needed.

Do we pay taxes? Yes we do. Annually.

Who maintains the website? I do. I have had a couple people comment that it is not up to date, but when I have asked for information, I have not received it. If you need something changed on the website, please let me know! If you want to be on the breeder referral list on our website, let me know because we don't automatically add you!

Have you submitted the membership list to AKC? We submit a membership list annually to AKC after dues have been collected. We are about ready to submit the list for this year.

Why haven't I received an updated membership list when I corrected information about myself? The membership list was sent out a little over a month ago. It will be updated and corrected as needed. Because this is the first time in years that we have distributed a membership list, we will probably send a corrected list out in the next couple months. Not everyone submits corrections quickly, so give them time! Once corrections are sent, the membership list will probably be updated annually.

Would you appoint me to the "XYZ Committee"? At this point, the "XYZ Committee" does not exist. The Board recently created a Fundraising Committee, but at this point, chose to not create any further committees. We have several areas in which people can volunteer in the club if they would like to help. Before we continue creating committees, we need to be certain that these other areas are covered.

Can I get a financial statement? Financial statements are prepared for our annual meeting as called for by the Bylaws. One was available at the January meeting. The Board voted at the February 22, 2022, meeting to have our books audited.

Has AKC approved the Bylaws yet? No. This is a slow process with AKC. The last time we amended our Bylaws, it took approximately one year for them to be approved.

Are there going to be any classes offered? Yes, conformation classes every other Weds. 6:30-7:30 starting soon! Stewarding classes 6:00 pm before the May, July, & Sept. meetings.

There's a start to all of your questions! We'll see you April 5 at 7:00 p.m. at the Carson City Senior Center, 911 Beverly Drive, in the Joshua Tree Room.

Meeting called to order by President Candy Roper at 7:09 p.m.

Motion Carolyn Goepner, second Elaine Oxborrow, to accept the February 2022 General meeting minutes as printed in the February newsletter. Motion passed unanimously (15-0).

Board meeting minutes from February 22, 2022, will be in the next newsletter.

Secretary reports:

None

Treasurer report:

Lexine Thompson reported the beginning balance was \$33,357.97 with income of \$370.48 for dues, repayment of motel room, and trophy donation, and expenses of \$456.00 for website, trophies, and phone for an ending balance of \$33,272.45.

We have at least one hotel room that needs repayment. Candy is still waiting for the AKC rep to make sure it wasn't charged to him. Candy contacted him and is waiting for an answer.

Committees

Match Committee:

Candy reported after the meeting last month, Denise Crites volunteered to be Match Chairman. Denise is in contact with Elaine Oxborrow. Marian Panter said the match application has been submitted. Thea Tsurumoto has agreed to do CGC, CGCA, and Trick Dog. She is hoping Truckee Meadows Dog Training Club will join us for obedience. There are judges lined up, one is Barbara Binder and she's not sure of the name of the other.

Show Committee:

Candy said the Belgian Malinois club is planning to join our show. They have asked for a letter of invitation. At the Board meeting, we decided to invite the Laekenois club to join us for either a specialty or a supported entry. They haven't responded to our invitation.

The Board voted to add \$500.00 to the trophy fund. Vikki Jaramillo said they are winding down and passed around a couple of trophies she and Yvonne Roscoe have purchased. She thanked everyone that has donated to the trophies.

Last meeting Denise Crites volunteered to do parking, however, after thinking about it, she decided not to. She would like to do Grounds, so she and Bob Kinney will work together. Elaine Oxborrow volunteered to be in charge of parking and electrical. Elaine feels a member should not do the actual parking because it is so involved. There are many other arenas that need help. She has talked to her electrical people for the show and is working on it.

Elaine Oxborrow is concerned about our raising RV parking to \$50.00 with electrical and lowering dry hookups to \$30.00 for the shows this year. We will have issues if too many ask for power and we can't provide it. Splitting the prices creates too many problems. She would like to keep the costs the same as they have been. Last year parking was \$35.00. It was just raised in 2019. Thea Tsurumoto made a request to reconsider the change to the RV rates. Motion Marion Panter, second Rick Berger, a request to reconsider the vote to raise the cost for RV's to \$50.00 with electrical and to lower non-electrical to \$30.00. On reconsideration the motion failed 0-15. Marian Panter made a motion to go back to the \$35.00 flat fee, second by Rick Berger. Elaine Oxborrow asked if as a club, does anyone feel we should raise the costs. Members said no. Motion passed unanimously (15-0). In the premium list it will say there is limited power available but it is not guaranteed.

Elaine Oxborrow wants to hire Bruce and Bert Rettick for parking as in the past. Last year Wayne Hayes didn't do what we expected, trying to save money which was around \$300.00. She has spoken with Bruce and he has volunteered to come to Carson City prior to the show, on his own dime, and go over where things are needed. Bob Kinney agreed with hiring out RV parking as it can be a 20-hour per day job. Ann Kinney pointed out that whoever does parking needs to make sure emergency vehicles can get in and out. If the club provides a hotel room for Bruce, it will save money as he wouldn't need to bring the motorhome. Lexine asked if we can find out how much it would save. Elaine will find out. Motion Ann Kinney, second Marian Panter, to bring back Bruce and Bert to do RV parking. Motion passed unanimously (15-0).

Elaine Oxborrow has people to do electrical for RV's along the tree line, but we will need to rent the rest of the electrical for the other RV area. Ann Kinney asked about boxes that Sieg Goepner and Bob Newman made. They are not to code.

Elaine Oxborrow said Fresno had some wonderful perks for exhibitors and we may be able to incorporate some into our shows. Maybe bring back the bags that were given to the RV's. She suggested again having the Mayor or Congressman to

give out BIS on Saturday only. We need to try to get the media here to film or a radio station may be a good idea. Elaine may have someone for the National Anthem. Ann Kinney said she has been to shows where you put your armband in a barrel and someone would win a raffle prize. The scissors vendor last year donated a nice pair of shears that can be used for a raffle item. Elaine asked if we can get some local vendors. Cindra Smith is doing vendors and is hoping to get more vendors for our show. Candy Roper will ask her to look into local vendors as well. We should have a couple of food vendors. Elaine said the shows had a box from Lions Club for old glasses and hearing aids. Maybe we could look into having a Pee Wee class for young kids which could get local kids involved. Inviting 4-H to participate would be a good idea. Elaine suggested putting a display behind the trophies for our BIS and RBIS ribbons and trophies. It's easy to set up the display on Friday and then it is finished. Cindy Craig mentioned having New Title ribbons as well. Lexine Thompson said we don't need to do all these in one year but add things to future shows. Carolyn Goepner really loves how we are doing a brain fest tonight but we need to go slowly incorporating them.

Rick Berger talked about Shalisa Neeley's accident. He has been in contact and so far, she is still hoping to come. She should know in the next month. Tim Catterson discovered he has a judging conflict with our show. If Shalisa comes, we should not have to hire another judge. Candy said that Tim has offered to judge the 2023 show for expenses only, no judge's fee.

New Members:

Steve Panter (Marian's husband) had his first reading for membership. He has been around dogs all his life and follows Marian wherever she goes.

Unfinished Business:

AKC has received our bylaws, but it can be a lengthy process. Late notices for membership dues have gone out. Only one has responded out of five so far.

There was discussion on the Al Lockett show. Candy Roper said at the last meeting it was voted to not do the show. Ann Kinney asked why we voted it down as it qualifies for AKC compliance. Several members are planning to participate anyway with Friends of the Northern Nevada Dog Fancy. At the board meeting we talked about the pet show. The Doberman club requested Bonanza issue a check to Candy on behalf of the Friends of the Northern Nevada Dog Fancy. We will return it less the cost of the vendor fee and electrical. The Pet Show is March 25-27 in Reno. Candy said if anyone was interested in bringing a dog to get in touch with either her or Ann Kinney. Rick Berger mentioned insurance and Lexine will make sure we are covered. Motion Yvonne Roscoe, second Marian Panter, to reconsider the vote to not go to the Reno Pet Show. Motion failed unanimously (0-15). Motion Ann Kinney, second Elaine Oxborrow, for Bonanza to participate in the Reno Pet Show. Motion passed unanimously (15-0). Anyone that wants to volunteer let Candy know. This will fulfill a requirement as public education for AKC. If you work the show, you get free admission.

New Business:

The board voted to have an audit of the books at a cost of \$200.00 and tax preparation at \$150.00-\$200.00. The board also voted to have handling classes every other week starting after daylight savings time again. It was suggested to ask for a \$10 donation to the club. There is not an instructor as yet. It was discussed having various members do the class.

The board also voted to have stewarding classes held at 6:00 pm prior to the May, July and September meetings with Jennifer Moxley running the class. Candy feels we should still put the Northern California Steward Association on standby. Candy will get in touch with them about using some if necessary. Rick Berger said the biggest complaint from judges at our shows has been stewarding. He wishes we had enough members to help, but usually we don't. Last show there was only one complaint about a hired steward that didn't hand out the trophy cards even though he was instructed. Rick said Owner Handled has made it more difficult for stewarding. Elaine Oxborrow agrees it is a better idea to hire at least some stewards from California. If a judge wants to steward, they can't steward until after they have finished their judging assignment. Lexine reported we spent \$150/day per steward other than the head steward. We also paid for the head steward's room at a very discounted rate. Motion Cindy Craig, second Marian Panter, in the interest of our show running in a most professional way we hire ring stewards for all rings. Lexine asked if we would still offer stewarding classes. Candy said yes as long as Jennifer wants to. Ann Kinney has old ribbons and stewarding books should Jennifer want to use them for training. Elaine Oxborrow said we shouldn't shut down people who want to help. We should be able shadow the stewards so we may be able to have more members steward at future shows. Motion passed unanimously (15-0).

Candy reported the board voted to have a fundraising committee to go to local businesses to be sponsors for us. At this time, we are looking for volunteers for the committee. Carolyn suggested on volunteers for fundraising and raffle the person needs to not be on any other committee so they can focus only on fundraising.

Motion Carolyn Goepner to adjourn at 8:28 p.m.

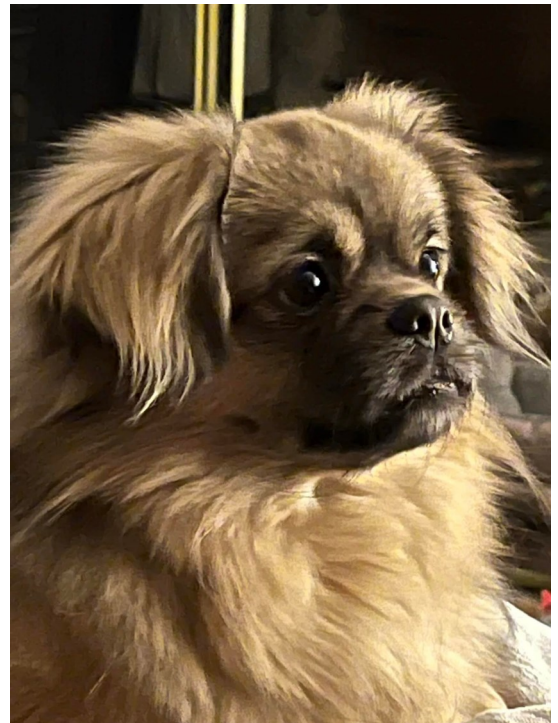

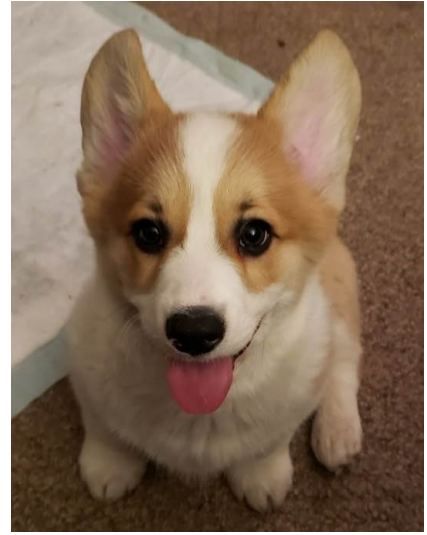

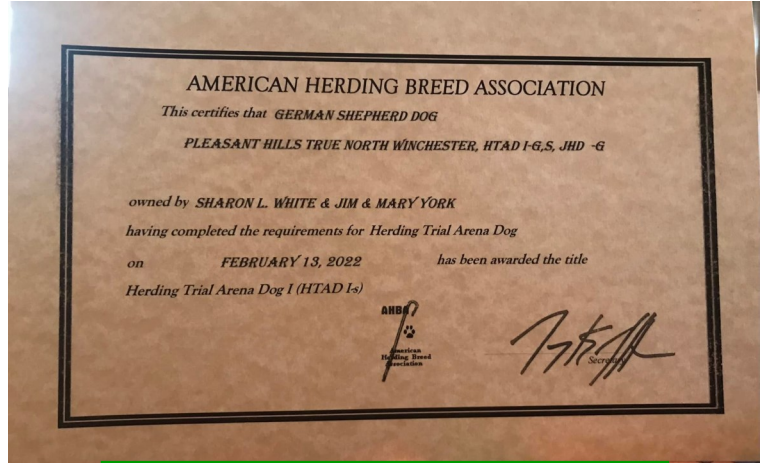

Board meeting called to order by President Candy Roper at 7:33 p.m.

Board members in attendance: Candy Roper-President, Lexine Thompson-Treasurer/Recording Secretary, Nancy Lovelady-Board Member, Vikki Jaramillo-Board Member, Bob Kinney-Vice President, Yvonne Roscoe-Corresponding Secretary

Motion Nancy Lovelady, second Bob Kinney, to accept the Board minutes from December 6, 2021, as printed in the December newsletter. Motion passed unanimously.

Secretary reports: None

Treasurer report:

Lexine Thompson detailed the miscellaneous expenses on the Profit/Loss that was sent to the board via email. The expenses were janitorial, pooper scooper, Truckee Meadows Dog Training Club (TMDTC) and the Carson High NJROTC for a total of \$2,150.00. Nancy Lovelady asked what the pooper scooper person does. Her job is to make sure the grounds stay clean by cleaning up after dogs as necessary.

Lexine reported the beginning balance was \$33,357.97 with income of \$370.48 with no expenses for an ending balance of \$33,728.45.

Candy reported there is still one club that owes for a motel room from our last show for approximately \$297.00 Nancy Lovelady asked about the AKC Rep that hadn't yet paid for their room. Nancy wanted to know how we handle the rooms. Candy explained we get a special rate and reserve a block of rooms. The specialty club judges use some of the rooms and the clubs reimburse Bonanza. Nancy wanted to know when they will reimburse us. Candy will remind them in the morning because they probably overlooked it. Nancy wanted to know if it was a club that comes every year. Yes they do. Vikki Jaramillo said they bring a very large entry. The board assured Nancy that the club always pays and it won't be an issue. The AKC Rep was supposed to pay for his room but Marriott charged us instead. He is checking to make sure they didn't charge him as well. It was around \$400.00 for his room. He has to wait for the information from AKC so it is a slow process.

Lexine Thompson asked to have a motion to have an audit of the Bonanza books for the cost of \$200 and tax preparation at the cost of \$150-200. Motion Nancy Lovelady, second Vikki Jaramillo, to audit the books and pay for tax prep. Motion passed unanimously.

Committees

Show:

Candy Roper reported our shows are pended but not yet approved. We usually have to ask them what they need and then it gets approved. AKC sent an email for a list of officers which Candy gave to them. It hasn't been changed on their website yet. Candy will follow up.

Candy said a few members have stepped up with donations of trophies, however, Vikki Jaramillo and Yvonne Roscoe are still short approximately \$500.00. Vikki said we should start requesting trophy donations as early as November in the future. Candy said we have money to cover but we should think about getting sponsors such as feed stores and veterinarians. Vikki said at their club back east, they were able to raise quite a bit for trophies by doing a raffle. If trophies are covered by fund raising, the remainder will go to show expenses. Candy suggested getting someone to run a raffle and Vikki said we could have a fundraising committee to get businesses to donate. Nancy asked how much money was spent on trophies. Vikki said it was in the profit/loss statement. It was \$2,677.31 which included VISA cards for Groups. Vikki and Yvonne covered the overage. Nancy asked Vikki how much they had to come up with personally. Vikki didn't know.

Nancy Lovelady asked if there is something generic we could purchase for new breeds such as water bottles with the Bonanza logo. Nancy will contact Dazzle or something similar and see what the cost would be. Bonanza would cover the cost for these because it would be for future years as well. Vikki is pretty much finished with the 2022 trophies but just needs money. It was decided that any recent donations will not count towards the \$1,500 budget, they will be in addition to it. Lexine said the donations should be made to Bonanza and then Bonanza will issue a check to Vikki/Yvonne. Nancy suggested raising the dues again in order to help cover trophies. Lexine said with a fundraising committee, a raffle, and donations from members, we don't need to raise dues again. It was agreed not to raise dues. Anything raised by a committee over the cost of trophies will go to other show costs or for 2023 trophies. We can discuss the ideas at a future meeting.

Nancy asked if a raffle would be silent auction or not. Candy said we haven't done one in the past. Bob Kinney has done a Paws up for Vets raffle at past shows. Nancy has done both. We don't know yet what we will do if we have a raffle.

Motion Nancy Lovelady, second Yvonne Roscoe, to create a fundraising committee. Motion passed unanimously. Candy will let the membership know at the March meeting and ask for volunteers. Vikki and Yvonne still need \$500 more for the 2022 trophies. Motion Nancy Lovelady, second Lexine Thompson, to add \$500 to the trophy fund. Motion passed unanimously.

Candy has been contacted by the Malinois club to hold a Specialty on Friday at our 2022 show. Last year they submitted too late to their National club. This year they expect to be approved. Nancy suggested sending invitations to the Belgian Laekenois club for Friday shows. Maybe they could use a provisional judge. Nancy asked about judges for the specialties. Candy said they can use one of our judges but provide any other judges themselves.

Nancy asked if all the judges' contracts for the 2022 show have been signed. They have been. Rick Berger is waiting to see if Shalisa Neeley will still be able to come. He is in contact with her and as of now she is planning on judging for us.

Denise Crites has volunteered to be the B Match chair. She has sent the application to AKC and is waiting for approval. The difference between B pup and B match was discussed as someone wanted both. It was decided it is basically redundant. Candy spoke with Denise yesterday and suggested we invite other clubs like Truckee Meadows Dog Training Club and Reno Kennel Club to offer events with us. We used to include other clubs and called it Dog Days of Summer. Thea Tsurumoto will do CGC for Bonanza. It was suggested to do a puppy class in a separate ring or after the B Match and charge \$5 to have someone go over the puppies.

Candy has been in touch with Jennifer Moxley regarding stewarding classes to be held one hour before our meetings. Nancy Lovelady says after daylight savings time starts, we could also have an hour-long conformation class at Fuji Park every two weeks with a suggested donation of \$10.00 per class to Bonanza. This would help people get ready for the match and the show. We could rotate instructors each time. Elaine Bergenheier sent an email asking to bring back conformation classes. We need to make sure we don't interfere with Guy Yeaman's classes. Nancy suggested doing conformation classes on Wednesdays. Motion Nancy Lovelady, second Vikki Jaramillo, to hold conformation classes on Wednesdays after daylight savings time starts, running from 6:30-7:30 pm every two weeks. Motion passed unanimously. Nancy said someone with the membership list can send out an email letting them know Bonanza will be holding conformation classes.

Jennifer Moxley has offered to do stewarding classes and would like to do them at 6:00 pm before the May, June and July meeting. Then those that have come to the classes can steward at the B Match. Nancy suggested the May, July and September meetings. Candy said we could talk to the membership at the meeting. Nancy said that since we have already talked about it, just let the membership know what we are doing. Motion Nancy Lovelady, second Yvonne Roscoe, to have stewarding classes at 6:00 pm before the meetings in May, July and September. Motion passed unanimously.

Unfinished Business:

Lexine Thompson sent an email to membership asking what they want on the membership list. Nancy would like city added to those that did not respond. Motion Nancy Lovelady, second Yvonne Roscoe, to approve the membership list with name, email, phone, city, breed, and kennel name, unless someone indicated they do not want some of that information listed. Motion passed unanimously. Lexine will email the list to the membership prior to the March meeting.

Nancy asked if we received a refund from the Al Lockett Pet Show. Candy reported the Doberman Club that donated \$660.00 specifically for the Al Lockett show sent an email asking that the money they sent for Friends of the Northern Nevada Dog Fancy to attend the Lockett show be given to Candy Roper to use at the pet show as it was intended. Friends of the Northern Nevada Dog Fancy is going to the pet show whether or not Bonanza participates. They will reimburse Bonanza for the \$180.00 that was sent to Al Lockett for electrical and the Reno vendor fee. That will leave a balance of \$480.00 to be given to Candy. Motion Lexine Thompson, second Nancy Lovelady, to refund \$660.00 less the \$180.00 and write a check for \$480.00 to Candy on behalf of the Friends of the Northern Nevada Dog Fancy for the donations previously received from the Reno Doberman club for the Al Lockett Pet Show because Bonanza is not going. Motion passed unanimously.

Nancy asked about Friends of the Northern Nevada Dog Fancy. Candy explained it is a collation of all types of dog groups except for humane societies. The group was formed mainly for public education where multiple groups can work together with a common name. Nancy asked if they would do a meet the breeds at our show. Candy will mention it to the group to see what they say. Lexine asked if she or others could come with a dog to the Al Lockett show and Candy said yes anyone can come, just that Bonanza won't be a part of the group.

New Business:

Candy received a text this evening from Jennifer Moxley asking to be assistant show chair for the 2022 shows and show chair for the 2023 shows. This is a volunteer, board approved position, and though Jennifer is very capable, there are other positions needing filled. For example, we need a grounds person, as well as fundraising, and training. Candy is not opposed to someone taking over as show chair at some point, but right now we have other areas that need to be filled. Lexine felt it isn't necessary at this time to change show chair. Candy is willing to continue but it is a board decision. Nancy said that if grounds is considered part of the show committee, Jennifer was show chair for five years for another club which included grounds. Motion Nancy Lovelady to have Jennifer Moxley be assistant show chair this year and show chair at the 2023 show. No second to the motion. Bob Kinney said as long as Candy is comfortable and willing, she should continue to be the show chair. There was discussion that the President, Show Chair, and Hospitality Chair cannot exhibit their dogs at our shows. The standing rules say they can't exhibit or handle a dog. Nancy asked why can't someone new that volunteers take on a job such as show chair. Lexine said there are many other positions we need filled so why not utilize them there. Nancy feels new volunteers **should** get a shot. Candy asked again if there was a second to the motion. There was no second. **Motion** failed for lack of a second. Candy will continue as show chair and will contact Jennifer about helping in other areas.

Candy brought up the RV hospitality bags we used to give out. It is a huge undertaking that exhibitors really liked. Nancy asked what would be in the bags. Chamber of Commerce would give us Carson City bags and we would put brochures from the area, veterinarian information, bottled water that Fandango donated, a couple large garbage bags as well as a few dog poop bags, candies, etc. Some pet companies donated individually wrapped samples. It would help the show be friendlier to do this again.

Nancy asked if Bonanza would be interested in doing a fast cat trial as a separate event associated with perhaps the B Match. Candy spoke with someone some time back regarding fast cat. The club made quite a bit of money from it. Candy asked what equipment is required. Nancy said a pulley, two hundred yards of plastic fencing and a timer. You don't need to be licensed and it is easy to run. Nancy said usually people pay \$25-30. You can have two trials in one day. There are different levels and it is an AKC title. Candy said there may be an issue with Parks because they only allow a certain amount of dog events a year. Candy will talk to the Parks Department to see if they are still limiting dog events. Lexine mentioned Terri Dickerson's location. Candy asked what type of ground is needed. Grass, possibly dirt, it has to be flat ground. We could maybe go to Douglas County as they are dog friendly or possible towards the Reno area.

Lexine read an email that she had just received that Elaine Bergenheier sent to the board asking to be chair of the membership committee. Candy didn't get that email. In November, Susanne Haug suggested forming a community outreach committee. Nancy Lovelady asked in November what it would be considered. It could be a community outreach committee for getting our name out there. In the past we have had a public relations person that would let people know about the shows, letting the newspaper know about our events, and making sure our name is known in the community. We will talk about the outreach committee at a general meeting.

Elaine Bergenheier also volunteered to do Judge's Hospitality at the upcoming show. We will have to ask her what she envisions that position would be. Nancy asked if that means for next year's show. We need to find out from Elaine Bergenheier at the next meeting what she has in mind. Our hospitality person has always been the person responsible for feeding workers and judges, is that what she wants to do? Nancy mentioned creating another committee and Vikki made the comment that we are creating too many committees when some of these things can be people volunteering to help. Nancy asked who the meals are for. Candy said it is for judges and anyone who works the show like stewards and parking. We feed approximately 40-50 people. This is included in the \$500.00 we donate to Kiwanis.

Nancy Lovelady asked about vendors at the show. Last year after covid was a bad year for vendors. This year Cindra Smith is hoping to get more vendors to come. Nancy asked if we charge for vendors. Candy said they pay \$35.00 per day for a space. Our show has never had a large number of vendors. Nancy asked if Cindra has experience. She shadowed Bob Kinney last year.
