### General Meeting Minutes

June 7, 2022

Meeting called to order by President Candy Roper at 7:00 p.m.

Candy Roper announced that Tony Yarbrough passed away on Memorial Day weekend. Tony's son Mark Yarbrough emailed Candy, then called her and said that Tony's defibrillator was sending strange messages to his doctor. Tony was called in a month ago and his doctor told him to prepare. Mark talked to Tony the day before he passed and he was fine. They didn't talk on Saturday because Tony was participating in some VA activities. Mark received a call on Sunday that Tony had passed. He fell asleep in his chair watching TV and peacefully passed. Tony will have a full military service on June 16, 2022 in Mesquite, Nevada. Candy told Mark the club will make a donation to a veterans group in Tony's memory. Mark said no, make a donation to an animal welfare group. They discussed Take the Lead. Marian Panter suggested we make a donation to Paws Up for Veterans.

Tony Yarbrough was lifetime member who lived in Yerington, Nevada. He was at a meeting a couple of months ago. Tony did a lot of legislative stuff for us and was around for a lot of years. Vikki Jaramillo stated that he had Siberian Huskies. Candy Roper said Tony lost his last Siberian Husky about a year and a half ago. He currently had a Papillon that Carolyn Goepner helped him get. Mark's mother-in-law took the dog, so nothing needs placing. When Tony would travel for the VA, Mark's mother-in-law would take care of the dog.

Motion Vikki Jaramillo, second Elaine Oxborrow, to approve the May minutes as printed in the newsletter. Motion passed unanimously. The minutes will stand as printed.

#### **Secretary reports: None**

**Treasurer reports:** Lexine Thompson is sick tonight. Candy Roper forgot to bring the Treasurer's Report that was provided. Candy stated that nothing was paid since the last meeting. At the last meeting the membership voted to make a \$300 donation to Meals on Wheels this month for use of the meeting room, which Lexine will do. We also need to send the Parks Department \$110 for the park for our match on July 9, 2022.

Elaine Oxborrow questioned the fee for the match, can we ask other participating clubs to donate? Candy Roper stated that the English Cocker Spaniel Club would be the only one if they decide to join us. Dolores McGifford was going to try to come tonight. She very recently had a hip replacement and didn't make it. Candy stated that the English Cocker Spaniel Club is just starting. Truckee Meadows will probably not come because they will be busy preparing for their July trial. The English Cocker Spaniel Club probably doesn't have a treasury as they are just getting started. Do we ask them for a donation or not? Candy prefers we do not and the membership agrees.

Candy Roper asked what we want to do for Tony Yarbrough. We usually donate \$100. Nancy Hurwitz stated that for all Tony has done for the club we should double it to \$200. Motion Elaine Oxborrow, second Thea Tsurumoto, Bonanza Kennel Club will make a \$200 donation to Paws Up for Veterans in memory of Tony Yarbrough. Motion passed unanimously.

#### **Committees**

##### **Match Committee:**

Terri Dickerson was not at the meeting. Candy Roper asked Thea Tsurumoto if she was going to do CGC at the match. Thea Tsurumoto and Marian Panter both stated they were going to do CGC/ CGCA and Trick Dog at the match and our show. Candy notified AKC of the new Match Chair, Terri Dickerson, and the paperwork was changed. The Membership agreed to keep entry fees at: \$5.00 pre-entry and \$10.00 day of match. Elaine Oxborrow stated the Match schedule is: Entries from 7:30am – 8:30 a.m., and judging starts at 9:00am. Candy stated that we need to get a flyer out to other clubs about the match. Do we have enough cans and poles to set up a third ring if the Cocker Spaniel Club wants to do a specialty match while we are doing our match? Another option is they could use our ring after we are done. Elaine Oxborrow stated that we need surveyors tape to mark the rings.

**Match Judges,** Candy Roper spoke to Barbra Binder. She will judge for us but cannot do Afghans, Basenjis, Borzois, or Whippets. The second judge will have to be able to judge those breeds. Elizabeth Blake of Sacramento will not be judging because she did not hear back from Denise Crites, so she made other arrangements. Judy Davis stated no commitment was made and she is probably not going to be here. Candy said a second judge is needed. Vikki Jaramillo suggested Wende Call who has Dobermans and teaches classes. Ronda Olk and Carol Healy were also suggested. Candy will

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suggest these people to Terri Dickerson if she doesn't have other judges in mind. She will reach out to Truckee Meadows to see if anyone there is interested if Terri asks for assistance.

### **Show Committee:**

Candy Roper stated she received confirmation from the Ring Stewards Association that we are on their calendar. Jeff Heim asked Candy if stewards were needed. She said yes, we are using the Stewards Association. Jeff said he belongs to the association and will be here to help because he is no longer handling.

Candy Roper contacted MBF about new title ribbons. They sent a picture that was circulated and discussed. We can get 1, 2, or 3 streamer rosettes. Elaine Oxborrow asked how many ribbons we need. Candy asked MBF how many we would need for 800 entries. They suggest 20 – 25 for starters. They are not dated so whatever is left over can be used again. If we order from MBF they can be added to the contract and the artwork is already done. The AKC logo would be in the middle and our logo would be on the streamer. If we go to another company, we will have to pay for the art work as well. Motion Elaine Oxborrow, second Nancy Hurwitz, to purchase "\$100ish" worth of 12" single streamer "New Title" rosettes. Motion passed unanimously. We need to decide on the color soon.

Candy Roper passed around a medallion sample as a possible future PeeWee award.

Candy Roper stated that she contacted the janitorial service used last year for a quote to maintain the bathrooms. She is also waiting for a quote from the printing company for the judge gift bags.

Elaine Oxborrow opened discussion about the 3 day show. AKC was contacted, Labor Day weekend is open. We must submit an application to secure dates. The Parks Dept. needs to be contacted about park availability. The Candy Dance and Street Vibrations are usually during our show. Weather would be more predictable. Burning Man and the Rib Cook Off conflict with a Labor Day weekend show. A lot of people go on trips that weekend. Elaine Oxborrow suggested we submit the application for Labor Day weekend, we can always pull it. Candy Roper has contacted AKC again to inquire about the conflict with our dates for a 3 day show. They have not responded. By chance Candy spoke to someone from Gold Country Kennel Club last week. They said they are planning on going back to their dates of Labor Day weekend as soon as next year. She is concerned about causing hard feelings with them if we take their weekend. It was a venue problem that caused them to change their date. Rick Berger asked if we are doing 2 or 3 days next year. No hiring of judges can be done until we decide. We have 2 judges contracted for our regular weekend. One judge was coming this year but had a conflict, so they will come next year, we just pay his travel expenses. Bonnie Lee has been hired for next year and the following year Alvin W. Eng. We have trouble finding obedience judges. Thea Tsurumoto suggested Carol Rybak for obedience.

Candy Roper asked are we switching to Labor Day. Any weekend there is something going on. Street Vibrations is the last week of September. The Candy Dance won't affect us this year or next, it's the last weekend in September. Elaine Tolle asked why the Candy Dance and Street Vibrations affect people coming to our shows. Candy said it does not affect attendance, it affects the availability of hotel rooms. Our judges are already booked but the exhibitors might have problems. We put it in the premium list, but by the time it comes out it's too late to let exhibitors know. Candy is concerned about the cost of fuel this year, it will increase judges expenses besides possibly causing lower entries. It will be a risk, we don't know what next year will bring. Elaine Oxborrow stated we don't have to do 3 days next year, but we can still do Labor Day weekend. Rick Berger said there are a lot of variables we need to get information about. What is going on in Carson City Labor Day weekend? Is there stuff going on that Fuji Park will be used for? If we are going to 3 days, we must decide now so we can get judges. Do we want to move it or leave it? Yvonne Roscoe answered leave it. Rick said he is more concerned about the 3 day show because that will impact things more than moving the dates. If we don't do it in the next month or two, we won't get a good slate of judges. Elaine Tolle suggested that with the cost of gas, if she were going to a show long distance, she would prefer a 3 day show because it costs the same. Candy said a 3 day show will increase our judge expenses. We will have 3 days of income, but extra travel expenses with more judges, some will be here only one day but will have the same travel expenses as those who are here 2 days. It will cost more. Rick stated it's not going to be exactly a full second slate, but expenses will be 1-1/2 times more. Last year we barely broke even. The extra expenses of janitorial and electrical we did not pay for in the past. Rick said another thing about the 3 day show, the people that are sitting here are probably the people who will be doing the extra work. Do you guys really want to put on 3 shows? After 2 shows I am done. Its a whole different thing, there is a lot of management and coordination to be done. We ain't getting any younger. Do you really want to do another day of work? Mo Shannon said if it ain't broke, don't fix it!

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We have to look at the offset of possible higher entries. Even if we do 2 days next year, it is something we really need to look at for the future. Rick stated if we are going to do this, let's find another club to join us and share the responsibilities. Some clubs like 3 days but I don't know the success rate. He spoke to Vicky Cook in Oregon. They do 3 shows and they like it. It's about 600 entries. Candy said Klamath does 4 days at about 400 entries. Rick states that AKC might even let them do it themselves with a show secretary to have 4 day shows, because entries are so low. Vikki Jaramillo said it's called "Show in a Box". You can have 3 shows, 2 in one day, 1 in the other. Rick Berger responded, that is because the shows are tiny, 200-300 entries compared to our show. They will never allow our club to do 2 shows in one day. They have to be in an isolated place. Elaine Tolle asked are there 2 or 3 day shows out in California or Oregon on the same day as our show? Rick stated the history of our show, 30 years ago in 1989, when the closest shows were in Southern California, we had 1800 entries. It was mayhem. After that, we had an average of 1300-1400 entries. Costco was not here yet so we had parking. Then all of the sudden there were shows in Oregon and Washington. They are the same weekend but far away. The reason we lost obedience entries was because AKC changed the rules and allowed trials in a shorter number of days. When we started this there were no other obedience trials anywhere around. Times have changed, you need to be realistic, in the last few years we averaged 800 entries, that's probably what it is going to be regardless. There are so many clubs having shows. Motion Yvonne Roscoe, second Mo Shannon, that the Show for the next year (2023) stays the same as this year (2022), keeping it on our regular weekend. Motion passed, 3 abstain.

Carolyn Goepner asked what if we wrote to AKC to hold the dates for Labor Day weekend? Gold Country will most likely get them back. They are held for 3 years, so if we change our minds we will be on the list. We don't have to do the 3 days we can start with 2 to see if we like that weekend. If we don't we still have our weekend reserved and can have our original dates. Candy Roper will check with AKC. Elaine Oxborrow said that according to her email they are holding these dates for us at this time. Grass Valley does not officially have it yet. Rick Berger said that these dates for 2023, if this is correct, they have a policy and Gold Country can come in and claim these dates.

### **New Members:**

Candy Roper – Third reading for membership for Steve Panter. He and Marian split their time between dog shows and car shows. At his first show the dog he took in won Winners Bitch. The membership voted unanimously in favor of Steve joining. Welcome to the club!

### **Unfinished Business:**

Candy Roper updated the officers list with AKC. Candy went to the meeting at The Board of Supervisors about Fuji Park and has the minutes if anyone would like to read them. They are short. Candy told them we donated grass, to the sprinkler system, and the culvert when Costco was built. She told them according to AKC figures, we bring one million dollars into the community over the weekend. Candy expressed concerns about RV parking with the median. They are putting water and electric in the west lot. They were told we are very concerned about the new dog park location and the entry gate to the dog park, which is in the main walkway between our show and the parking lot. Dog park dogs often get out of cars off-lead. That part was originally left out of the minutes, it was caught. Those minutes were being approved on the day Candy attended another Supervisors meeting and she read them and emailed them asking they put it in the minutes. They did. So it is on record that we object. They have no funding and no plan approved yet. It was a preliminary Master Plan presentation. Basically they were voting to say that they are doing this.

### **New Business:**

Candy Roper asked if we want to have our July meeting at the match. Motion Carolyn Goepner, second Elaine Tolle, there will be NO meeting in July. Motion passed unanimously.

## Board Meeting Minutes

May 25, 2022

Board meeting called to order by President Candy Roper at 7:35 p.m.

Board members in attendance: Candy Roper-President, Lexine Thompson-Treasurer/Recording Secretary, Vikki Jaramillo-Board Member, Bob Kinney-Vice President, Yvonne Roscoe-Corresponding Secretary

Motion Vikki Jaramillo, second Yvonne Roscoe to accept the Board minutes from February 22, 2022, as printed in the newsletter. Motion passed unanimously.

**Secretary reports:** None

**Treasurer report:** Lexine Thompson had no new treasurer report as there were no changes from the general meeting May 3, 2022.

Lexine is getting ready for the audit in the next month or so.

Candy talked about changing Bonanza Kennel Club to a 501C3. We need to proceed right away. It changes our fiscal year. Tony Yarbrough is willing to help with the change as he does it all the time with the VA. It will mean we can solicit local businesses as a non-profit as the donations are tax deductible. We may be able to get businesses to help cover Groups or even Best In Show.

### **Committees**

**Match:** Yvonne got an email from AKC that the membership list was received. We can change the Match Chairman to Terri Dickerson as she is on the membership list. Candy will let AKC know we are changing the Match Chairman.

**Show:** The Malinois club will do a scent work fun match. They will offer five different levels from beginner to advanced at \$10 per run and \$40 for all five runs pre-entry. The cost will be \$15 per run day of match. Elaine Oxborrow asked Candy if we would get anything so Candy contacted the club and they responded they will give Bonanza Kennel Club 10% after expenses with a minimum of \$150. It will be listed in the premium.

Candy is sending the premium tonight. She will get a quote from the janitorial company. We need to get a lock and chain for the north gate by the building because last year the Carson City High School ROTC had problems with some exhibitors getting upset because they weren't allowed to come in that gate. Lexine asked if the ROTC has been contacted to help this year. Candy has talked to the commander and they want to do it again. He suggested calling back after school ends in June.

We need to get a new telescoping pole for the speakers to replace the one that was damaged a couple years ago. Candy said it should be under \$100.00

Elaine Oxborrow has volunteered to get the pipes and drapes for the judges' area.

Candy talked about judges' gift bags and wanted to know if we should do them the same as last year. She will try to get prices to see what more canvas bags will cost. We should need about 8 bags which includes Rick Berger, although he may not want one.

At the April meeting, setting a meal allowance for judges was discussed. Candy will ask around to see what other clubs do but we haven't had any issues. It's a good idea to check.

Rally for our show is still showing pending at AKC. Candy was finally able to talk to someone and found out the Rally Department is separate from the conformation show department. Our representative said they process rally applications manually and they haven't gotten that far to approve. It may be a couple more weeks.

AKC needs an updated list of officers because Nancy Lovelady resigned. Candy will submit a list as soon as we appoint someone tonight.

Candy reported that for the premium the club voted to do reserved grooming with electricity by the vendors. We had the area with electricity available last year but no one used it. We can change it in the premium if we want to, but for now it will say \$10 per day for electrical grooming. Candy put down Bob's name for now because he is doing Grounds. No one has volunteered to be in charge of reserved grooming yet. If someone steps up before the final proof, we can amend it. It will be outdoor only and the exhibitors can remit to Bonanza Kennel Club or Pay Pal.

## Board Meeting Minutes

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The club voted to allow juniors to show mixed breeds this year. They need to get a canine partner number prior to the show. Candy said it seems most clubs aren't liking mixed breeds being allowed even though it is supposed to be how the junior handles the dog not the dog itself. AKC is doing a new year long pilot program to allow juniors to show a dog that they do not own. It is effective 7/1/22. Most clubs seem happy about this program, but the mixed breed allowance may not make it.

Candy suggested that Bonanza Kennel Club should offer the \$100 award to OHBIS which is the same as BIS. Motion Lexine Thompson, second Yvonne Roscoe, for the club to offer \$100 for OHBIS. Motion passed unanimously. Lexine said most OH feel slighted when they receive small ribbons instead of rosettes for OH Groups, OHRBIS and OHBIS. She asked if we had rosettes for OH. Candy said we did and they are the same as regular Groups, RBIS and BIS. Instead of \$100 to the OHBIS last year, a \$50 gift card was given and Judy Davis donated a basket of her product.

Candy talked about how difficult it is for us to find silver dollars for the BIS trophy anymore. Last year Lexine couldn't find enough for the two days so we had to offer the small dollar coins. We may have enough for this year, but Lexine will need to check. The reason for the silver dollars is because we are the Silver State. Candy said that Silver State Kennel Club in Las Vegas offered silver ingots that were donated by veterinarian hospitals. The Carson City mint probably won't have anything we can get. Maybe there are medallions or a die could be made with our logo. Lexine suggested maybe looking at the Legislative Gift Shop for something. We should be ok for this year but we need to find another option for future shows.

In the past, Candy said the club has given a director's chair for Best Junior. Last year and this year it is a \$25 gift card each day-one for Best Junior and Reserve Best Junior. Vikki is giving a blanket and pillow this year with a multibreed pattern.

Vikki touched on what happens when we give trophies. When it is time there needs to be an easel given in addition. This year there are 60 easels needed. We have some from last year. There are 3" ornaments that will need small boxes to put them in and there are 46 of those. Yvonne and Vikki get all the wrapping and do the work to wrap the trophies. There are 9 more pictures that need frames. Sharon gave 15 frames to help. Vikki and Yvonne will go to thrift stores to see what they can find. Candy commented on how much work they do as well as paying some of the expenses on their own. Vikki would like more help. Mo Shannon said she likes to do fund raising so once we are a 501C3 it will help. Vikki mentioned Cindra Smith found a trophy at an estate sale and Lynn McLellan gave a Shih Tzu cookie jar that will be used this year. Members need to look throughout the year to help find breed trophies.

**Grounds:** Bob doesn't have anything right now. Candy said Cindra is working on vendors. She will have at least two food vendors and hopefully Cowboy Coffee. Last year there were people asking Kiwanis if they could buy coffee from our kitchen because the lines were so long at the food truck. Candy had some business cards from potential vendors and gave the information to Cindra.

**Unfinished Business:** Candy reported the bylaws are still pending at AKC. After she submitted them she found a conflict regarding the membership dues and the lapse needing to be sixty days after calendar year not fiscal. She will review and make suggestions to the club and resubmit the change. The 501C3 application will affect the fiscal year so we need to get it done.

Candy went to the Board of Supervisors meeting on May 5<sup>th</sup> but only had three minutes to talk. She spent about one minute explaining Bonanza Kennel Club incorporated in 1981 with our first show in 1989. Then she talked about things we have donated including improvements to Fuji Park such as sprinklers, grass, and culvert. She also told them that AKC estimates we bring over \$1,000,000.00 into the local economy. She said we have concerns regarding the Master Plan. Parking with a median can affect the RV parking. They said there is more parking in the new plan than is currently there. They plan to pave and put electrical in the RV area. Candy says it looks like there will be less parking. The layout for the playground area is a concern and the park needs more open space than they are showing. Candy feels maybe if they move the playground to the northeast corner so it isn't in the middle of the open area that large events need. They are excited about bringing in concerts, but Candy said parking is a problem. Moving the dog park takes up our ring area as well. The gazebo will be gone and a pavilion will be near the current children's area. There is also a concern where the dog park gate is near the west bathroom. Candy mentioned the wind issues and said there should be a wind break on the west side of the pavilion. They mentioned this nice stage would be great for dog shows as if we show our dogs on a stage. She invited the supervisors to come to our show to see how it is run.

Candy invited the Governor to present BIS at our Saturday show about a month ago but hasn't heard back. If she doesn't hear back, she will talk to the mayor.
