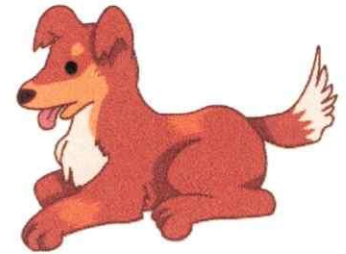

February 6, 2018 Corrected General Meeting Minutes

Meeting was called to order by President Candy Roper at 7:04 p.m.

Motion by Sieg Goepner and second by Gail Spieker to accept the minutes of the January 2, 2018 general meeting as printed in the January 2018 newsletter. Motion carried unanimously.

Minutes for the January 29, 2018 Board meeting not yet ready as there wasn't enough time to get in the newsletter. They will be included in the next newsletter.

No report from the corresponding secretary.

No report from the recording secretary.

Treasurer report from Bob Newman:

Beginning balance \$28,647.96 ending balance \$28,767.95.

Committee Reports:

Show committee-Application has been submitted to AKC. The only thing they are waiting for is the membership list which is ready to go.

Still need kitchen help for the fall. Chris has been sent an email but she has not yet responded. Terri Jones was suggested, but Candy was hoping to have some numbers from Chris prior to contacting Terri.

At the Board meeting it was agreed to ask the Steward Association to give us a quote. They will work with some of our own. They would provide some stewards and train our stewards that do not have experience but want to volunteer and work with them in the ring. We are in the process of getting a quote to see what that would cost..

Sieg requested sign frames for RV parking 18X33 in size that open up like an A frame. He would like 3 frames at approximately \$47/each which would cost about \$150.00. This would help keep RV's from going in the wrong area. He has not yet received an answer from 2 places for the estimate for the 18X33 sign with an arrow saying "Parking" but will try to have information next month. If the club approves he will order. Motion made by Judy Davis to allocate \$150.00 to purchase the 3 A-frame holders for signs, second by Nancy Hurwitz. Motion carried unanimously.



Because we have no kitchen help at this time, there will be no spaghetti feed this fall.

At the last meeting we talked about the requirements for holding a show and whether we would meet AKC requirements if we didn't hold a match. We need 2 of the requirements to qualify. We are already on the list for Responsible Dog Owner's day every year and we do breeder referral service. We also do new exhibitor briefings and hiring provisional judges so we have at least 4 requirements to meet the criteria meaning we could get by without doing a match.

Judy mentioned we have a new member coming in that does agility and has most of the equipment. We could maybe do agility with our July match to help bring in more people. This will help make us more of an all-around club. We could make it a fundraiser.

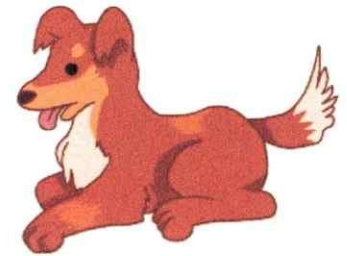

Meeting was called to order by President Candy Roper at 7:06 p.m.

Sieg made a motion to accept the minutes for the February 6, 2018 meeting as published. Discussion on two corrections in the minutes pertaining to membership applications. Thea Tsurumoto was printed as her first reading and should have been second reading. Kim Crowther had her first reading. Motion seconded by Gail. Changes will be made to minutes. Minutes approved unanimously as corrected.

Sieg made a motion to accept the November 1, 2017 minutes as corrected and the January 29, 2018 as published in the February Newsletter. Carolyn seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

No secretary reports.

Committee Reports:

Sieg said there would be back to back Papillon specialties, sponsored by the Nor Cal Papillon Club, on Thursday before the Friday Sierra Nevada Papillon specialties.

Sieg also has a meeting by the end of the month with the Visitor 's Bureau to promote the show.

The sign holders came to \$128.97. The best price for the signs to put on the frames are \$22.00 each. Permission to spend \$66.00 for the signs. This should help people in RV 's from going into the wrong area. Motion made by Judy Davis second by Carol Colavecchio to purchase the 3 signs at \$22.00/each. Motion passed unanimously.

Rick is ready to start judge 's assignments and should be done next week or so. We are getting ready to hire for next fall. Let Candy or Rick know any suggestions. We 've had a problem with a club member talking to a judge and promising them an assignment that neither Rick nor Candy knew about. The judge thought they were hired for three days. We do not hire for three days, only two. The specialty clubs hire for the first day. Candy had to write the judge to tell them we can 't use them this year. If you are a specialty club and want us to hire a specific judge, you need to talk to Rick or Candy, not anyone else.



Bob Kinney is now a CGC evaluator and is willing to offer a CGC test at the fall show. Discussion regarding having it at the show was positive for the basic CGC. Thea Tsurumoto is also an evaluator and can do CGCA which is advanced. Candy said we should set aside time to do CGC. Cost would be between \$10.00 to \$20.00. We will discuss this further at another meeting.

Candy said if anyone is going to make trophy donations let Candy or Carolyn know so it can get it in the premium list. There is approximately 6 weeks before the deadline.

It looks like the Border Collies are going to have a supported entry at the fall show.

Candy was in contact with Chris regarding food for the fall show and Chris will not be here so Candy will contact Terri Jones. Judy said that Terri is available.

New member applications-three people Thea Tsurumoto, Patti Moore and Kim Crowther are here but Evin Crowther is not. Kim said if he needed to be voted on separately to just remove him from the application. Dave Lauffer is not present. Patti Moore and Thea Tsurumoto are third reading and Kim is second reading. Patti Moore has lived in this area since kindergarten and has worked for the post office for more than 20 years. She has three Tervs and has 2 GCH, does nose work, herding titles, therapy and treasurer for the Northern Nevada Belgian Tervuren Club member of Truckee Meadows Dog Club and Belgian Sheepdog Club. Thea Tsurumoto moved here recently from the Bay area. She has Aussies but has had numerous other breeds. Her young aussie last weekend got really nice agility awards competing in the PASA trial (Peninsula Australian Shepherd Club). He also finished his Rally Advanced. Kim Crowther has a Terv and she follows in Patti 's footsteps. She did nose work last weekend and her Terv got Nose Work II.

Motion made by Judy Davis to accept Patti Moore and Thea Tsurumoto into the club seconded by Sieg. Motion carried unanimously.

No unfinished business.

New Business:

Lex brought up discussion asking if Bonanza ever gave donations for a National Specialty. After discussing it was decided it would be like Pandora 's Box and not a good idea.



Jane Meyers talked to the members about the National Owner Handler 's Series (NOHS) and answered questions. She gave out handouts to explain the NOHS. Handouts are attached.

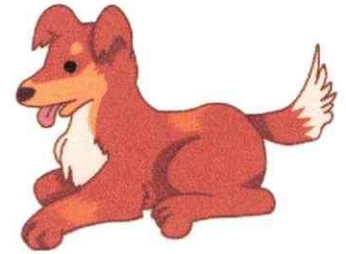
Jane answered questions regarding the cost to the Club for holding a NOHS show. She said there isn 't any additional cost. The only extra person needed would be one steward for the NOHS group. The cost to the club would be ribbons.

Sieg mentioned that he has had 3 judges say they won' t do NOHS. Jane said it should be in the contract so the judge knows they will be doing the owner handled group.

Jane talked about other ways to increase entries. Adding 4-6 puppy helps because all owners of puppies get the information. Large percentage of new puppy owners have never shown and gives them a way to start. Another entry builder is Open shows which are FSS and miscellaneous and are very big right now. You would need 2 extra judges each day. Concurrent B Matches can be done the same day as well as concurrent A Match instead of waiting until 30 minutes after show. A club can add Junior Extravaganza which can be done concurrently.

Still no word of the Ring Steward Association.

Gail made a motion to adjourn at 8:12 p.m.

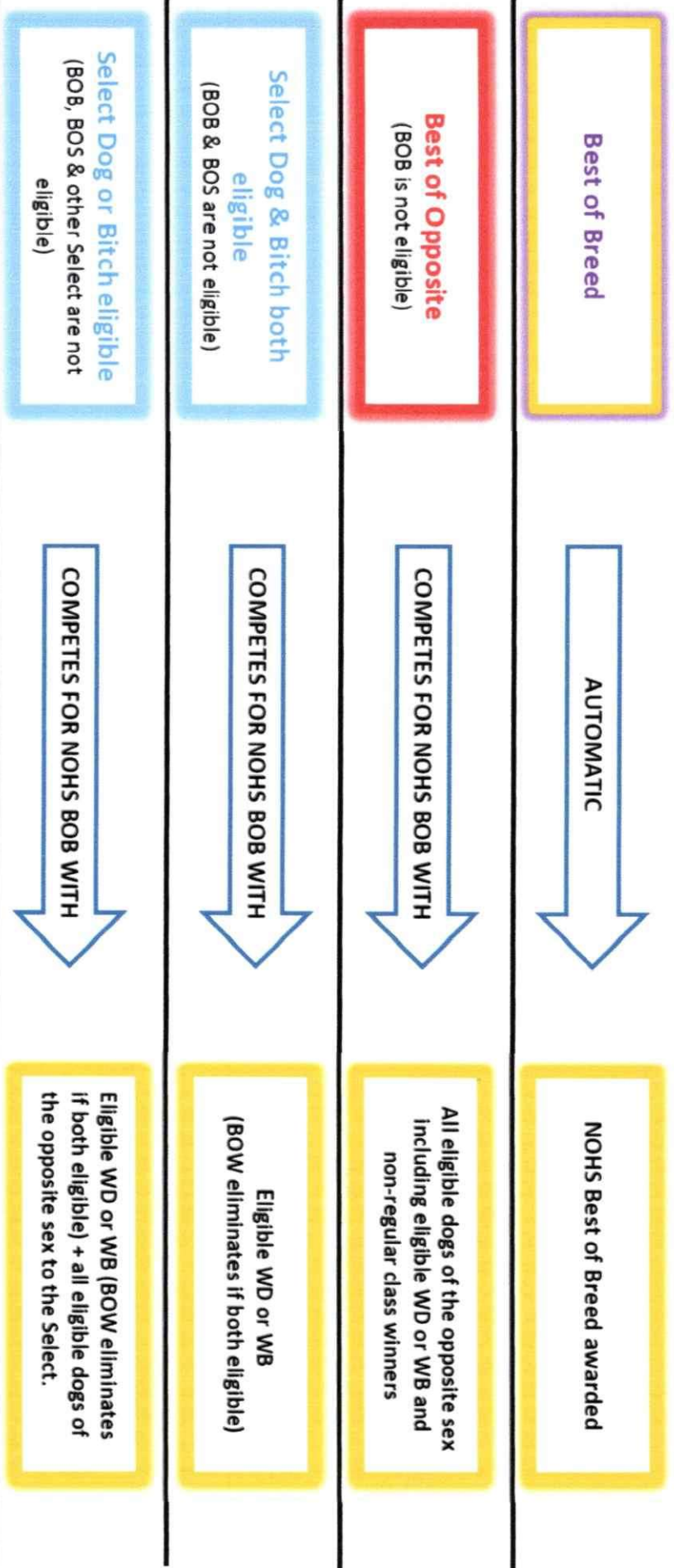

Designating NOHS Best of Breed



Once the judge has awarded BOB/BOV, BOW, BOS and Selects

- Steward should compare the eligible entries against the awards
- Advise the judge of the awarded dogs indicated as eligible to compete (*) in the AKC National Owner-Handled Series (NOHS)
- Determine by the flow chart which entries remain in the ring for the designation of NOHS Best of Breed



If none of the above awards (BOB, BOS, Select Dog, or Select Bitch) are indicated as eligible, judge is to award NOHS Best of Breed from any eligible dog competing for Best of Breed, including WD and WB. BOW will eliminate the Winners of the opposite sex automatically.

Dogs must be entered in the NOHS Competition to be eligible for NOHS Best of Breed. (Indicated by an "***")

Only those dogs indicated by an asterisk (*) and eligible to compete for NOHS BOB (entered in BOB, move-ups, 1st place non-regular, WD & WB) are eligible for the NOHS award. Eligible Select DOES NOT automatically eliminate eligible same sex Winners.

National Owner Handled Series

Did you know that more than 80% of show dogs are handled by their owners? To celebrate the dedication and enthusiasm of owner-handler exhibitors the American Kennel Club has created the new AKC National Owner-Handled Series. This non-titling competition will be held at select dog shows across the country.

The AKC National Owner-Handled Series will be conducted following Best of Breed judging in each breed ring. All dogs in the BOB competition (including WD & WB) will stay in the ring after the judge makes their placements in BOB competition. The ring steward will ask all professional handlers, household members and current assistants to professional handler to leave the ring and then the judge will then select the Best Owner-Handled (BOH). The dog and its owner will continue to accrue points for any group placements or Bests in Show.

The top-ranked dogs from the AKC National Owner-Handled Series are posted on the AKC National Owner-Handled Series Points Ranking page. Rankings of the dogs competing in the Series are compiled based on the Best of Breed, Group, and Best in Show placements in this specific Series competition (See Point Schedule). The end of year competition for the AKC National Owner-Handled Series will be held in conjunction with the AKC show in December. Dogs that finished ranked in the top ten (plus ties) for their breed during the qualifying period will be invited to compete in the competition. Dogs exhibited by professional handlers on the day of the event are not eligible for this competition. Dogs exhibited by current assistants and household members of a professional handler on the day of the event are not eligible to enter this competition.

Professional handlers are defined as any person who belongs or has belonged to a professional handlers' organization, distributed rate cards, or otherwise advertised or represented themselves as handling dogs for pay within the last five years.

NOHS Point schedule

Note: AKC National Owner-Handled Series points do not contribute to championship points.

At an individual show a dog earns the cumulative number of AKC National Owner-Handled Series points associated with each placement.

Owner-Handled Reserve Best in Show	75	Light Green
Owner-Handled Group 1	30	Neon Pink
Owner-Handled Group 2	20	Neon Green

Owner-Handled Best of Breed	5	Maroon
