## October 1, 2019 General Meeting Minutes

Meeting called to order by President Candy Roper at 7:07 p.m.

Motion by Carolyn Goepner, second by Nancy Hurwitz to approve September 3, 2019 minutes as printed in the September newsletter. Motion passed unanimously.

**Secretary reports:** None

**Treasurer report:** Lexine Thompson has been sick so there's not a complete treasurer report. The check from MB-F was \$23,699. There will be with another check from them when they close out the shows. There was income of \$5,915 for parking. This show was the best for RV parking for a long time. Cost for Bruce was \$1,080.

**Committees: Sunshine:** Kim Crowther's husband passed away recently from Huntington Disease. Candy suggested Bonanza make a contribution to the Huntington Foundation in his memory. Cindra Smith made a motion to donate \$100.00, second by Lexine Thompson. We will make a donation as soon as we have all the information.

Sieg has been under the weather (**NOTE:** Sieg passed away October 19<sup>th</sup>)

**Show:** Candy thanked everyone that helped make the show a huge success. Tracy Gunter and Terri Hanks stepped in for Sieg who couldn't make the show (he helped from the sidelines) and did a fantastic job. There were all positive comments such as A+ A+ A+ from the German Shorthair Pointer Club. Sieg asked that we thank everyone who helped Tracy and Terri with grounds. Candy mentioned there is much more than just opening and closing the show. There was an email from an obedience/rally judge thanking Cindra for transporting to and from the airport. Cindra took both obedience/rally judges to Virginia City and the judge said it was the most fun she has ever had after a show! TMDTC did an outstanding job stewarding. Jane Myers didn't have one complaint on ring stewards!

Saturday afternoon we ran out of paper towels so Lynn McLellan went to Costco and bought some. Bob and Ann Kinney stepped up and cleaned the bathrooms in the main building Saturday night. Rick Berger said Parks has always done this but in the future if they are not going to provide the service, we need to look into a janitorial company to clean for the weekend. We need a key for the paper towel dispensers. A Parks employee said we didn't contract for toilet paper and paper towels! Tracy said he knows there was a change in personnel and the contract amount was the same as last year so if it was not included we were unaware. Shawn Petersen kept busy keeping up with emptying the trash cans. Rick mentioned it was the fastest take down of tables and chairs he's seen. Thank you to the judge that stepped up to help as well.

For those that helped, please prepare a list of duties and time frames that could help for next year's show for tasks needing to be done. We need way more volunteers!!! This will help the show run even more smoothly.

Some exhibitors were using the area where CGC was to be held as a bathroom for their dogs and not cleaning up, so CGC had to be moved, but it probably worked out better for CGC! The marking that Bob did for them was ignored by exhibitors. He said we need to get stakes and marking tape for the CGC area next year, Thea Tsurumoto said she had a great turnout for CGC, CGCA, Trick Dog and Star Puppy. The area used was perfect and will be the location for CGC at next year's show. We may want a sign that states something to the effect "Please don't allow your dog to relieve itself on manmade items". Carolyn said the obedience ring once again was used for a pooping area. Thea suggested maybe an area set up just for relieving dogs with a bucket and bags.

Cheryl Knight who was busy cooking in the kitchen for Kiwanis had to chase off people who were grooming on the judges eating tables.

Parking was difficult because so many would ask to drop off and said they would leave and then they stayed. Lexine finally had to just say no. In the future they can drop off outside the gate and leave their rig running. We may need a sign stating who is allowed to park inside with no exceptions. Handicap placards were in abundance and it was difficult finding spots. Some remembered MB-F used to have signs for parking. Carolyn suggested maybe roping off areas to help people know where to go.

Candy said Bruce had all Parks Department power cords returned. Bob said Bruce had a list for checkout but cut out early and left a pile of cords unattended. Bob saw them and used the golf cart to pick them up. There was barely room for all of them. Tracy mentioned that leaving them unattended left them open to be stolen. Terri saw homeless people going through trash and coming and going throughout the show so they were in full sight for anyone to take.

Candy read an email from Shawn Petersen thanking "Tracy for his dedication to the show and all of his hard work." Shawn suggested a motion to reimburse Tracy and Terri for lost entries as they chose to work rather than show. Tracy and Terri declined the offer but said thank you. Shawn continued "we need better communication of what "set up" and "tear down" mean. What needs to be done, and what kind of time requirement is necessary?" He also suggested we get a janitorial service for next year's show as the bathrooms in the building were "disgusting". We need to talk to Sieg and the Parks Department to see what we are expected to provide and what they are supposed to do.

Candy mentioned ring times can be set for a specific time to make sure our members can show.

Bob Kinney told Tracy what an incredible job he did. He asked for a lifetime commitment. Tracy declined ; )

Candy mentioned an incident first thing on Saturday morning where a Boxer jumped out of a car and tried to attack a Corgi. The Corgi owner injured a finger which was later examined by Bob Kinney. Another woman cut her face when she fell into the side of the building trying to protect the Corgi but seemed to be alright. The Boxer hit the window button in a car that was left running and jumped out. Candy spoke to all except the owner of the Boxer. She was supposed to come talk to Candy but didn't follow through. Jeff Heim knew everyone involved in the incident and told Candy he would have a serious talk with the owner of the Boxer. To Jeff's knowledge this is the first time any of her dogs has had an issue. He said it was a "comedy of errors." When the Corgi owners left on Sunday they thanked us for a good show. They didn't file any charges. Had they filed charges, we would have had to have a bench.

Rick said that Charles Trotter told him the Kiwanis Club is a keeper! He has a special diet that we weren't told about in advance and Kiwanis bent over backwards to make sure he was taken care of. We asked Pat Trotter what we could do for him but she said she saw her husband sneak a cookie so he could eat the rest of what was there too!

Trophies were a big hit thanks to Vikki Jaramillo and Yvonne Roscoe's hard work. Because of the weather they brought the trophies inside and made cards for stewards to give to the winners. Some stewards failed to hand out cards but most trophies were picked up. Some people wanted to buy some of the trophies thinking they were raffle items! There was a small mix up with the mini Aussie and the Aussie pillow where a little girl had a pillow snatched out of her hands but Vikki and Yvonne said they would make another Aussie pillow for the woman who snatched the pillow. In 30 years Candy and Carolyn have not seen so many trophies. We failed to put a trophy in the premium for a Russell that a woman thought she had won. We were able to give it to her as it was outside the ring. She was very excited. It is sometimes the small things that some don't appreciate but others are so grateful. Rick mentioned that in his ring there were 5 or 6 breeds with Best of Winners cards but there wasn't a BOW. If it's in the premium as BOW it can't be given to another placement. They can be used next year. Carolyn resigned as Trophies Chairman. Vikki said she will make sure as many breeds as possible get a trophy next year. Thea mentioned that Robin from TMCC makes bags and such if we needed things.

On Saturday the BIS Silky handler talked to Candy and said she usually does Southern California shows but she liked our venue better than any venue in the San Diego area. She came here this year because she liked our judges. She suggested that if we move the Toy Group indoors we might interest more Toys in attending.

Cindra Smith commented she that heard unhappy remarks about all Groups and BIS being judged by the same judge on Saturday. Candy said we just wanted to try it as other clubs have done the same. Maybe having a different judge for BIS would have been better. Rick said that Pat Trotter is an all-breed judge and has seen and chosen her picks for the groups and can then put up her choice for BIS was logical. We won't be doing that again, it was possible only because of the judging lineup this year.

Bob reported a food vendor hit and bent a pole and pulled out the wire to the PA system. Tracy fixed the wiring. The vendor was aware she did it and was willing to pay for the repair. Tracy said it wasn't necessary and he would fix it.

Our canopies are in need of repair. We need to research to see if we can just replace the tops.

Carolyn said she will be in charge of decorating the judges eating tables next year. Bob said it will be taped off for the judges.

Ann and Bob said cleaning on Saturday was difficult because people left grooming items in the building. The area was full of crates. Next year we need to limit the number of crates per exhibitor that are allowed. If they want to have more they can stack crates. It was hard to get to the rings in the building because of all the crates. Candy will put something in the premium list about leaving items in the building overnight.

Thea wondered if we could put something in the premium to stake canopies. One went flying because it wasn't staked.

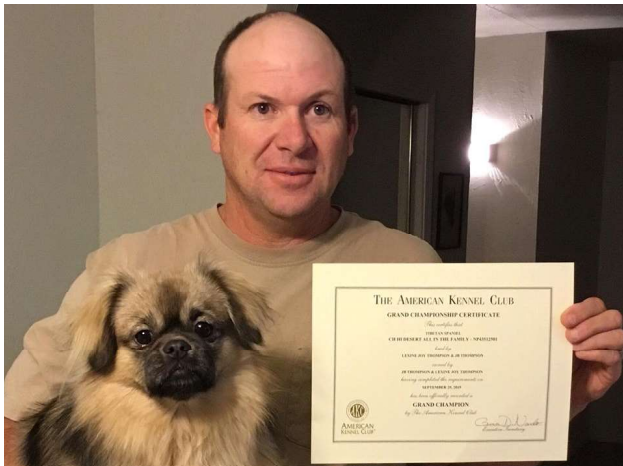

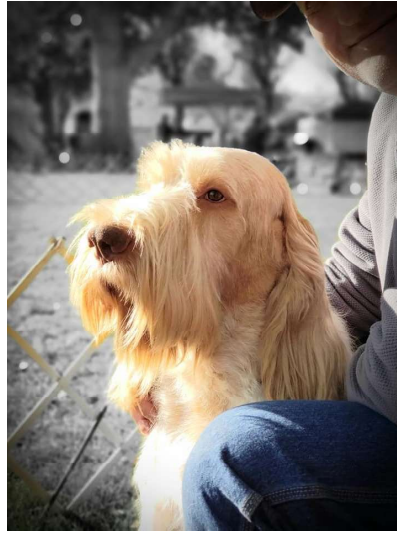

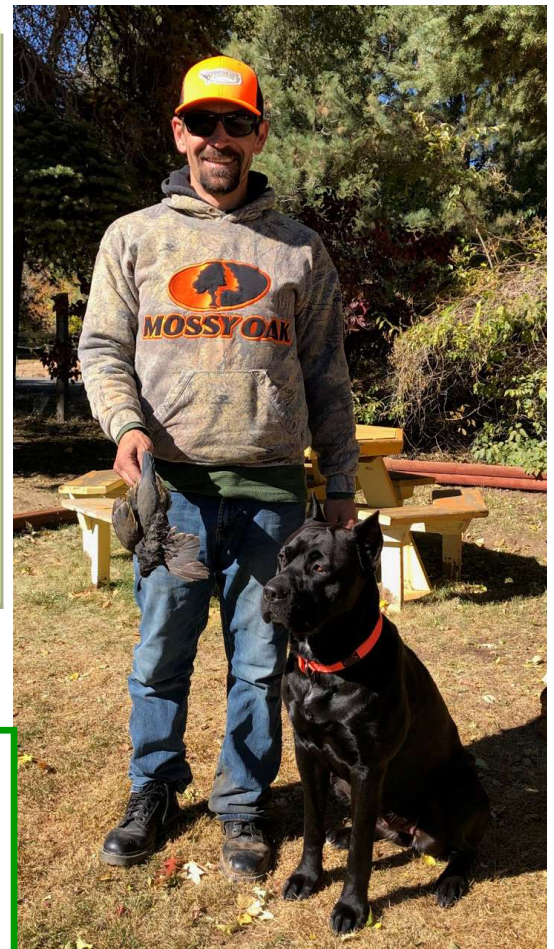
**Tribute to a Best Friend**

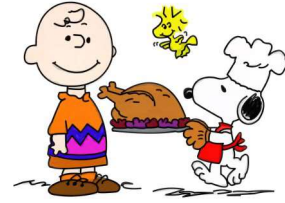

Several of you know that I have been wanting to get “back out in the community” to let people know we’re still here & to educate the pet owning population. Our phone has all but stopped ringing & while I don’t particularly enjoy spending a lot of time on the phone, I feel that we are failing in part of our purpose. In years past when we participated in community events, our phone rang a *lot*. Some of you have been around long enough to remember when (many years ago) Northern Nevada dog clubs / groups, spearheaded by Bonanza, got together & attended the Al Lockett Boat, Sport, & RV Show as a "vendor". We participated as "Friends of the Northern Nevada Dog Fancy" ~ an all-inclusive name, & set up a booth as an educational outreach.

We provided information about AKC events, training, dog sports, breeder referral, meeting information, etc. We played AKC videos, handed out brochures, & had small obedience demonstrations. Every 3-4 hours we changed volunteers in our booth. Each new volunteer brought in a new breed[s] of dogs for show visitors to meet. Our booth was a popular one ~ other vendors came by often to see what kind of dogs were there!

Our area has always had a good variety of beautiful dogs to showcase. We tried to make as many of these breeds available to meet the public as we could. NO PUPPY SALES are allowed at an informational event such as this, it is strictly an educational endeavor.

AKC provides brochures for events like this. I’m not sure if they will charge for them now ~ I’m checking in to that. They have a lot of information available online.

At the meeting Tuesday I want to discuss having our club participate in the Reno Pet Show next March. I am in the process of reviving “Friends of the Northern Nevada Dog Fancy” now. I have started a facebook group in that name for discussion about participating in public education events like the pet show & fairs. If I missed inviting you to join the group, please look it up & submit a request to join! People who don’t live in this area are welcome to join the group & participate. You don’t have to belong to a club to join in, you just need to have an interest in positive public pet education! You are welcome to invite your friends who are interested in helping promote the dog fancy & responsible pet ownership to join this facebook group!

Now for some good news! Our shows were very successful this year! Our entries were up again where they normally are, with 836 dogs! (Last year we barely had 700.) The weather didn't cooperate with us & Sieg was at home instead of with us, but it seems everything else went well. We got nothing but positive feedback about what Tracy did in Sieg's absence. Tracy took on a big task keeping the grounds going & did an **outstanding job!** Thank You so much Tracy & Terri. I'd also like to thank those many other members who stepped up & helped out. There were **so many** of you who made the work go better, from trophies, judge transportation, setup, keeping up with the trash, ring stewarding, cleaning the bathrooms, gate watching, hospitality running, pooper scooping, catalog sales, announcing, break down, & so many other things I am forgetting right now! I'm not naming names because I will miss someone or something important, but **Thank You!**

Dan Kastens from the Parks Department told me our show was the largest show he's seen us have since taking his position, yet it had a "minimal impact" on the park condition. They were very happy with the job we did with cleanup! I discussed the issues with the bathrooms that we had. I was told that normally on Sunday morning a Parks employee comes through and checks everything. However, everyone I spoke with never saw a Parks employee come through to check on them. They actually **close** park bathrooms for most public events (carnivals, fairs) & require groups to bring in & maintain port-a-potties because they don't have staff to keep everything up. We will probably need to look at a janitorial service for next year. We will meet with Dan after the holidays to get direction on what we will need to do next year. With Sieg not at the shows this year, I gained a whole new respect for the position of Grounds Chairman! That person is responsible for everything from reserving the park to being sure the bathrooms have toilet paper & paper towels! We have a lot to learn ...

The host hotel, Gold Dust, had no problems with exhibitors & dogs this year & they were very happy. Last year we were concerned that we might lose them because of problems they had with dogs barking when left unattended, dogs eliminating in rooms, & unconcerned or rude owners.

Trophies ~ what can we say ... Vikki & Yvonne did an amazing job, contributing an unbelievable number of trophies for the shows this year! When the weather didn't cooperate & let them distribute trophies to ring-sides, they created cards so exhibitors could come inside the building to collect their prize. Good Job & Thank You Ladies!

AKC Rep Jane Myers didn't receive any complaints about stewards. That's a step forward for us! She told me our show went well. There was an incident early Saturday morning where a Boxer jumped out of a car window & went after a Corgi. The Corgi was unhurt but two humans were slightly injured trying to protect him. The injuries were not caused by the Boxer, but from banging into things trying to protect him. The Corgi owner chose not to file a complaint.

The next meeting is Tuesday, November 5, 7:00 p.m., Carson City Community Center, 851 East William Street, Carson City. See you there!
